May. Time 9 - 69.

Defense Secretary Melvin Laird - first of the U.S. contingent to arrive home from that Midway meeting. At a plane-side news conference - explaining that the first twenty-five thousand troops to be withdrawn from Vietnam - will be pulled back in units. These to be "heavily weighted" with combat forces - from the Army and Marines said he. Adding that additional cut-backs could be ordered possibly by August - and at "regular intervals" thereafter.

Ultimate goal - said Melvin Laird:"Vietnamization"of the entire war. Meanwhile, in Paris - Communist peace negotiators were blasting the whole idea of a troop withdrawal - as expected. Calling it a "crude farce" - a propaganda move to appease public opinion both at home and abroad. The Kremlin also branding it - too little and too late.

Reverse side - a formal statement from the

British Foreign Office. Calling the planned troop

withdrawal a "unilateral contribution" on America's part 
to promote a peace agreement through "serious negotiations.

Here at home - the psychological impact

perhaps uppermost in mind. Observers noting that if

nothing else - the high water mark of nearly twenty years

U.S. involvement in Vietnam - is now apparently passed;

and never to return we hope.

Back in Saigon - another homecoming today 
Life arise for South Vietnam's President Thieu. Paking advantage

of the occasion - to reject again the idea of a coalition

government with the Viet Cong. Adding that any politician

who advocates such a government - will be "severely

punished." However, Thieu expressing confidence that

the mechanics of Free elections - including Communist

participation - "can be decided at the negotiating table."

Turning to domestic affairs - an economic break-through today if such it can be called. For the first time in modern history - the nation's major bank raising their prime interest rates to eight and one-half percent.

An increase of one full point - over the previous seven and a half percent charged on business loans.

Reaction in Washington - a quick charge of
"conspiracy." Chairman Wright Patman of the House

Banking Committee commanding a full investigation;

followed by prosecution - if called for - under Federal
anti-trust laws.

In the Senate - it's signed, sealed and all but delivered. The man who will serve as the nation's fifteenth Chief Justice of the Supreme Court - sixty-one year Warren Earl Berger; confirmed today - by a near-unanimous vote.

Clearing the way for his posension to the post now held by Earl Warren - as soon as the present court term expires.

Judge Berger's confirmation - following remarks
by Senate Minority Leader Everett Dirksen - who said:
"I do not expect the new Chief Justice to become an
arch-conservative or an arch-liberal - I do not expect him
to be the left of center or right of center - I only expect
him to apply common sense and the wisdom of the laws."

That - from Senator Dirksen.

In the meantime - the "Warren Court" was busy handing down another batch of decisions. today. Including one - upholding the "fairness doctrine" in radio and TV.

Another forbidding the garnishee of a worker's wages - without first granting them a hearing. A third blocking Senator Dodd of Connecticut - in an attempt to sue columnist Drew Pearson for publishing stolen documents. These - you'll recall - the basis for Dodds later censure by the full Senate.

A year to the day after it was formed - the

President's Commission on Violence today filed its first

official report. Topic "A" - campus riots. The Commission

asserting that college administrators - have often been too

slow to react to trouble. Adding that all school officials

should develop plans - for dealing quickly and firmly with

student violence. However, the report strongly opposing

any attempts - to cut off Federal financial aid to student

militants.

More on the same - from New York; where the American Bar Association has condemned - forthe first time - violent student protest. Further declaring that campus riots - have "no justification in law or morality."

According to ABA president William Gossett - the way statement, "inspired" by a meeting with President Nixon two weeks ago.

Famed evangelist Billy Graham - a guest today
in New York City. Getting ready to start his second
"Crusade for Christ" - in the nation's largest city. By
his own admission - older and tireder" than he was in his
first crusade in New York - twelve years ago. Nevertheless
