WEATHER

New Mexico to New Zealand -- it's cold outside - as if you hadn't noticed by now. The mercury hitting sub-zero readings today - in no less than thirty-five states. Matching or smashing previous all-time lows - clear across the land. International Falls, Minnesota; reporting thirty-five below - Glens Falls, New York - thirty-three below -- Fort Wayne, Indiana, seventeen below - Cleveland ten below - Detroit eight below.

In addition to the cold - snow, sleet or freezing rain adding to the havoc across two-thirds of the nation. With the death toll - mounting rapidly; and new storm xuxxxx warnings posted tonight - from New Mexico to Louisiana. Also xxx cold wave and hazardous driving warnings - in Eastern and Central Montana.

On the war front - a gallant stand today barely fifteen miles from Saigon. With a handful of American troops - pouring out a steady stream of bullets against almost hopeless odds. Through sheer courage and determination - finally beating back a massive enemy attack from across the nearby Cambodian border.

with the Viet Cong attempting to seize control of a provincial capital. Fighting raging through the stored streets of Khiem Cuong - from just past midnight till dawn.

Attacking guerillas overrunning streets sections of the town - kiba killing thirteen and wounding twenty-six - half of them civilians. But unable - try as they night - to take the U S command post. In the end - allied forces killing at least nineteen; while capturing five more /+ of the fleeing enemy.

At the Stanford Medical Center - Palo Alto,

California - a sudden setback today for America's

first adult human heart transplant patient. Doctor's

reporting ** mid morning ** that former ** that steelworker

Mike Kasperak was suffering from internal bleeding;

also - liver trouble. The bulletin further saying
his condition is now "critical."

Exact cause of the bleeding - hard to pinpoint.

Doctors noting that Kasperak suffers from chronic lung

disease -- in addition to heart trouble. Adding only

that they hope to combat his present condition - with

massive blood transfusions.

Ironically, the heart of that dead California
housewife -- apparently still beating firmly in Kasperak's
breast. Doctors earlier reporting nothing at all - to
indicate that his body was rejecting the new heart.

CAPE TOWN FOLLOW PALO ALTO

Better news - from Cape Town; where dentist

Philip Blaiberg - was finally permitted to leave his

oxygen tent today. Dr. Christian Barnard reporting himself

"ninety-nine and nine-tenths percent satisfied" - with the

condition of his own second heart transplant patient.

That remaining "one-tenth of one percent" - said he
"simply the element of uncertainty."

Dr. Barnard adding that he has already started preparations - for his third human heart transplant.

The paraplanned patient—a man suffering from "cardio-myopathy," a form of heart disease—restricted almost extirely to black Africans.

America's latest goodwill Ambassador to

Africa - on tour today in Kenya. Vice President Hubert.

Humphrey - mixing business with pleasure. Getting

up around dawn - for a tour of Nairobi's national game

park. Watching lions and other wild animals -- roaming

free in their natural habitat. Before a scheduled hour=

Before he was done. Hubert Humphrey promising adolitional to send a number of American experts to Kenya; to assist in solving that country's - long and short range water problems, also asking Kenyatta for a check-list of Kenya's needs which the United States conceivably could fill.

At the same time - the Vice President stressing the importance of cooperative self-help projects; such as road, power and communications links - between Kenya and neighboring Somalia and Ethiopia.

Here at home - at the L B J Ranch - President Johnson conferred again today with Israeli Premier Levi Eshkol. White House Press Secretary George Christian - reporting their talks had "covered the waterfront", including, xoo in particular, a discussion of U N peace efforts in the Middle East - where there was still another border clash today. In a later statement - referring to an Israeli request for additional U S arms - the President promising solely to give the matter his active and sympathetic examination.

followed by a visit from Mohammad Ibrahim Egal of

Somalia - some time in March.

Turning to politics - the Democratic National Committee held a brief meeting today in Chicago, — Against a background of bitter cold, laying the ground-work for next summer's Democratic National Convention.

Along the way - Democratic National Chairman

John Bailey brushing aside talk of an apparent party

split, over the peace candidacy - of Senator McCarthy

of Minnesota. Bailey preferring instead - to talk about

Republican dissent.

Said he: "When the Reagan forces get through with Romney - when Nixon's friends fixx finish with Reagan - when Percy reveals his inner-secret thoughts about Rockefeller when Rockefeller lowers the boom on Nixon and Reagan, like he did on Goldwater; - on that day" - said Bailey - "on that day there will be less talk about splits in the Democratic Party."
