at the United Nations, In the wake of Security Council action

4 rejecting Russia's demand for condemnation of Israel And

rejecting a demand for withdrawal of Israeli troops 4 from socalled Arab lands in the strife-torn Middle East.

The Security Council no sooner adjourned - than US Secretary General U Thant began an immediate poll of all UN member-nations, An search of majority support for Russia's next request -- an emergency meeting of the full General Assembly, One that could be called to order within a matter of twenty-four hours.

Approval, a foregone conclusion. the stage is

now set for world debate on the Arab-Israeli superior.

With Soviet Premier Kosygin - expected to fly to New York in person to present the Soviet case. Raising speculation that other world leaders will soon follow; turning the

UN session - into a world summit meeting.

MOSCOW

At the second time a clue perhaps to the line the Kremlin will pursue at the U.N. This in an article -- in the Soviet newspaper Trud. Falling the entire Middle East war -- the result of a plot by the U.S. Central Interligence Agency.

It all began -- says Trud -- with a meeting of fifty C.I.A. agents in Beirut. The original plan -- to foment a revolution in Syria. But unable to swing it because of Soviet opposition -- says Trud, -- the C.I.A. decided instead to promote a so-called "noiseless coup" in Tel Aviv. This supposedly setting up -- quote, "a military government -headed by the extremist Moshe Dayan."

Trud concluding that: "Blood, ashes, sufferings of hundreds of thousands of people -- these are the obvious results of the U.S. spy

#### LUXEMBOURG

Another clue to possible American policy - at that meeting of Nato Foreign Ministers in Luxembourg, where the Middle East crisis - was again the major topic of discussion today.

U.S. Secretary of State Dean Rush telling his colleagues - that no one in the world can tell either side in the conflict to do anything. Not the United States -not Russia -- not even the UN -- said he.

Dean Rush further asserting there can be no lasting settlement - except **through** through direct negotiations between the warring parties. Adding that the UN, in the end - can be nothing more than a mediator in the dispute.

#### STATE

A related item - from the US State Department in Washington. Telling of a Soviet proposal to put all the world's major waterways - including the Panama Canal - under strict international control.

The plan - we're told - Russia's answer to

### RABAT.

Meanwhile, at Rabat in Morocco -- a sudden hitch today in plans for an all-Arab summit conference, Arabat to coordinating Arab policy -- in the diplomatic war against Israel.

King Hassan the Second of Morocco sending an urgent message to President Ismail Al Azhari of Sudan -- who originally called the conference. Telling Al Azhari that such a meeting -- could not schieve "the anticipated result." Suggesting instead a meeting of Arab foreign ministers -to evaluate the possibility of forming common policy. Tupisia, Kuwait and certain other Arap countries -also said to favor the lower-keyed foreign ministers meeting With Cairo later predicting that Massan himself soon wild SAMUL visit the United States -- to present the Arab viewpoint

to President Johnson.

To the North - a series of scattered skirmishes today - in provinces bordering the D M Z. American and South Korean troops - **class**claiming a toll of nearly fifty enemy dead.

# RED CHINA

Latest from Red China - a public admission today from the Central government - that Peking has all but lost control -- of those fanatical Red Guards; that the student movement 4 is now creating and trying to carry out its own policies.

None other than Premier Chou En-Lai - author of the government indictment, Felling the Red Guards to return to the directives of their creator - Chairman Mao before they do irreparable harm & to China's "cultural <u>r</u>evolution."

Chou adding that "thoughtless acts" of the Red Guards - "have given nothing but great pleasure and advantage to enemy countries." Toughest statement yet against the Red Guards. Also in the Far East - a battle royal today at Secul, South Korea. One of the biggest riots ever - in that part of the world. With an estimated Twenty thousand students -- batti battling police through the streets of the city; in a third streight day of violent demonstration against alleged "rigging" of last week's south Korean parliamentary elections.

Mearly Fifty policemen injured -- more than four. hundred students under arrest die when peace of sorts returned to Seout However, the student revolt - maybe just getting started. Student leaders saying their next step 4 may be a drive to overthrow the entire south Korean government, Just as they disposed of the government of Synghman Rhee - back in Nineteen Sixty.

## EDDIE EAGAN

A good friend - a warm companion - a great guy - dead loday in New York. Colonel Edward P.F. Eagan -- one of America's most famous sportsmen - victim of a lengthy illness.

Colonel Eddie - a tremendous fighter in his day. US amabeur heavyweight champion in Nineteen-Nineteen an Olympic World Champ the next year. Though he never fought for money - earning the respect of some of boxing's all-time greats, sparring for fun with Gene Tunney, Jack Dempsey, Tommy Gibbons and many others.

Eddie later crediting boxing - with his rapid rise from rags to riches. The poor boy from Longmont Colorado - winning a scholarship to Yale. After that, Harvard Law School with honors - and on to Oxford as a Rhodes Scholar. He and the present Duke of Hamilton, then Marquis of Douglas and Clydesdale, went around the world"taking on all comers." Quite a linguist too.

# EDDIE EAGAN - 2

When he came home he married Peggy Colgate a Colgate heiress.

Eddie served as US District Attorney for southern New York; New York State Boxing Commissioner for six years associated with President Eisenhower in the People-to-People movement, finally serving as director of sports for the recent New York World's Fair. Along the way winning a second Olympic medal; as a member of the winning four-man bobsled team -- in Nineteen Thirty-Two. Colonel Eddie Eagan - only sixty-eight -- leaves

a void no one can fill in the American sports scene.

### LONDON

From London -- a progress report today - on studies currently underway at Britain's Royal Free School of Medicine, . Studies dealing with chimpanzees and baboons firying to figure out why they act the way they do. Dr. John Napier explaining that chimps and baboons were chosen for the project - because they are the creatures most like Man. The chimp supposedly having a common ancestor with Man - about twenty million years ago; the baboon - as many a common ancestor with Man about sixty millions years ago.

Why then is Man alone - so far advanced 'in the process of evolution? The answer - Says Dr. Napier apparently, in the fact that, early Man - was the most curious, most inquisitive, most adventurous of his ep species. Leaving the simple forest life & in pursuit of pleasure on the open plain, Where he was forced to join with his kind - to fight off the enemies, to battle starvation, to build, to prose progress.
