A massive attack against air pollution urged today by President Johnson in another message to Congress.

The President calling for enactment - of a series of new and stringent anti-pollution laws. Beginning with authority for the federal government -- to step in and establish its own pollution controls; wherever local and state governments -- fail to act on their own.

The President saying that some progress has been made - in recent years. "Yet the pollution problem is getting worse" - said he. Adding that unless we do more - now - the battle will be lost within ten years.

On another front - the President today called for creation of four national parks. Including a Redwoods

National Park -- in northern California; as part of a plan -for "protecting our national heritage," said Li.

This our "last chance" said the President - to

"preserve a significant acreage of these primeval Redwoods."

-- were widely discussed. The Pontiff also said to have

In Viet Nam - USB-fiftytwo's to the attack today
- less than twenty miles from Saigon. The big bombers
raining tons of explosives - on a Viet Cong base camp
and staging area; suspected headquarters for up to two
thousand enemy troops - operating in the Saigon area.

Meantime, another Viet Cong ambush today,
directed against a U S minesweeper - in the Lao Tau branch
of the Saigon River. The seventh such attack in the same
area - aex over the past week.

Major ground action - confined to a single battle near the village of Ban Lanh; suspected kan headquarters for Viet Cong political activities - in the northern provinces. US Marines killing twenty-six of the enemy - before the rest of them fled into the jungle.

Sukarno of Indonesia - under fire once more today.

Some forty thousand students - with army backing - marching through the streets of Jakarta; demanding that Sukarno be branded officially a traitor - and removed from office.

While thousands more demonstrated in the city of Taskmalija -- on West Java; demanding that Sukarno's picture be removed from all government offices - and from all private homesto.

Sukarno himself - under virtual house arrest in his quote -- "freedom palace" unquote. The Army barring all visitors from the palace grounds - also blocking all telephone calls, in or out.

The bodies of America's first team of Apollo

astronauts -- carried today to their final resting

places. Heroes in the struggle to reach the moon.

Air Force Lieutenant Colonel Virgil "Gus"

Grisson and Navy Lieutenant Commander Roger Chaffee to be buried tomorrow at Arlington National Cemetery.

Air Force Lieutenant Colonel Edward White - to be buried at the US Military Academy at West Points - in the words of mourners - three men who gave their lives - "to points on way."

Back at Cape Kennedy - a fatt investigation of the tragedy still under way. Complicated by conflicting reports - of whether the ill-fated Apollo-One was on internal or external power.
