Moscow - Soviet officials today authorized the the immigration of an additional thirty-five Russian

Jews. Allowing them to leave Russia - without having to pay a so-called education tax. The Soviets now having granted forty-four such exemptions in the last two days.

The development of a new style artificial heart - is reported today from Minnetonka, M innesota. The man who built it Dr. Harold Kletschka - a former open heart surgeon. Dr. Kletschka's new heart - consisting of a miniaturized thirty-watt motor attached to centrifugal rotators; a non-pulsatile pump - which means it has no pulse at all.

The best of Catherine now bound for the U.S.; the first collection from Russia ever loaned out to the West.
