In the darkness, swarms of American planes,

daylight came, the fighter bombers took over, and
continued slashing at the convoys.

To support that assault, the sabre jets
flew out in strength today - one formation of thirty
one making a sweep almost to the Yalu River, the
Manchurian sanctuary. They ran into a Red air fleet -

sixteen MIG fighters and eighteen propeller driven fighters, escorting a formation of twelve Russian built light bombers. This is the first time Red bombers have been reported in Korean skies, ever since last June.

The sabre-jets began by hitting the M I G's. knocking down one of them, and breaking up the jet fighter escort. Then they went after the slower propeller driven fighters, and three of these were shot down. All of which gave the Sabre-jets a chance at the bombers, slow and lumbering compared with the flashing speed of jet. Of the twelve enemy bombers, six were destroyed, three damaged - only three escaping unscathed. The Sabre-Jets had a field day, flashing at the bombers, ripping one after another with streams of bullets. Later, in another encounter, another M I G was shot down.
