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In the midst of widespread insinuation and inuendo - Spiro Agnew speaks out - as no doubt you've heard by now. The Vice President branding as "damn lies" - published reports that he was somehow involved in a Maryland kick back scandal. This in a press conference today in the executive office building, right

Spiro Agnew saying he originally intended to remain silent - following his earlier statement asserting his innocence. "And since I have no intention to be so-skewered" - he went on - "I called this press conference; to label as false and malicious and scurrilous - these rumors, these assertions and accusations that are being circulated." TWhereupon - the floor was open to newsmen.
