GOOD EVENING EVERYBODY:

A final blast of war today with Pakistani planes dive bombing on the bazaar section of the Sikh city of Amritsar. Killing a hundred or more and injuring many others.

Then, suddenly -- dramatically -- came the cease-fire nearly three hours ahead of the six o'clock deadine -- set by the United Nations. A hundred U.N. military observers -quickly assigned to the disputed Kashmir border area. To supervise the immediate withdrawal -- of all military forces.

Both sides emphasi ing that this is a cease-fire -- and not a lasting peace. But both sides have agreed "in principle", at least -- to speedy peace talks. Most likely -on Soviet soil.

## INDIA FOLLOW PEACE

As for the border dispute between India and Red China -apparently it also is ended for now -- but hardly forever as noted today by Indian Prime Minister Shastri -- in an emotion-filled address to the Indian Parliament.
"Ultimately" said Shastri "India and Pakistan have to live together -- as good neighbors." As for the continuing threat of Red China -- he called that an even greater challenge adding that India's armed forces -- must "remain vigilant $a 11$ along the frontier;" ready at a moment's notice -- "to repel the Chinese aggressor."

A bonanza today - for allied forces in Vied

Nam. Those Americans, Australians, New Zealanders and South Vietnamese - combined in a continuing search and destroy mission - north of Saigon.

The find - an abandoned two hundred bed
Communist hospital -- barely forty miles from Saigon.
Also an ammunition factory - eatable turning out
bullets, mortar shells and grenades.

The area heavily tunneled and booby-trapped
indicating that the Communists once intended to defend
it strongly. But today's bag - only a dozen guerrillas.

The rest -gone into the bursa bush.

On the debit side - continued Communist
harassment today southwest of Saigon. The Vet Cong over-running a pair of government outposts - fifty miles
fromthe city. Vietnamese losses described as "heavy" although government forces have since reclaimed both installations.

The Defense Department today ordered a draft of nearly two thousand physicians, dentists and to
veterinarians; Starter in January.
That's about double the number of doctors drafted this year - and last. The increase necessary said government officials - to "provide health services required - by the increase in active armed forces."

The Pentagon noting an expansion of our military
might -from less than two point seven million men - to more than three million men, As a result of the war in Diet Nam. The number of doctors who have volunteered so far - said to be "insufficient to meet the build-up."

A few hours later - the full Senate gave final
approval at last - to the administration's long-sought

Immigration Reform Bill. Abolishing the controversial
national origins system - of past immigration quotas;
But restricting for the first time - immigration both
from Latin America and Canada.

Bolivia's two co-Presidents left Lafaz today -
for a tour of the tin mining towns in southwest Bolivia. Where mob violence has taken a toll of more than thirty dead -and more than a hundred wounded, in the past four days.

The area - comparatively quiet at last report;
With more than a thousand heavily -armed troops - guarding there ie
all major streets and highways. Nevertheless areport
from Llallagua - that three detectives held hostage by the miners - were killed early today and their bodies dumped in the pits.

In any case, resentment among the miners seems

fact that for the first time - the children of miners took part in the fighting. Standing side-by-side with their parents -- and hurling sticks of dynamite at advancing government troops.

That declaration of religious liberty safely out of the way -- the Ecumenical Council turned its attention today to another controversial issue: birth control.

The subject arising during debate - on a document
entitled - "on the church in the modern world", Calling for "responsible parenthood" among Catholics - but clearly avoiding the issue of birth control per se.

Twelve prelates in all-criticiafis the measure
on a dozen different scores. Archbishop Amici of Modena, Italy, for one - calling for a positive statement - now.

Said he: "The question of birth control should not be dragged out any longer; - a solution found as soon as possible."

On another important front - the Council today
approved combined efforts of Catholics and other Christians to produce a common Bible. Nearly two thousand for it only twentyone against.

Tornado-1ike winds swept through Michigan's Calhoun County today -- causing widespread damage. And capping a weather binge clear across the nation -- on this the last day of summer.

In addition to the tornado -- something for everybody.

A Bermuda high in the East -- with resulting heat wave.

Meanwhile torrential rains -- from Indiana to Texas; causing floods that have driven some fifteen hundred persons from their homes in Oklahoma alone. And finally another snowstorm over the Rockies; with heavy snow warnings tonight for Montana.
