MOSCOW

Moscow - a post-script today on the fate of Russia's latest Venus probe. The Soviets reporting that their Venus-Seven - did not disintegrate in the fiery atmosphere of Venus, as originally suspected last month. Instead - we are told the Russian space ship actually did descend safely to the planet's surface; there continuing to record information - which it then relayed back to earth.

On the basis of this information, the report goes on, surface temperature on Venus - about Eight Hundred and Eighty-Seven Degrees Fahrenheit; atmospheric pressure - about One Thousand, Five Hundred and Twenty-Three Pounds.

Meanwhile, at Cape Kennedy there was a planned pause today in the final countdown for America's moonbound Apollo-Fourteen; during which ground crewmen loaded liquid oxygen - into the ship's new third life-support tank. This to serve as "insurance" - against the possibility of another mishap such as that of Apollo-Thirteen.

At the same time, astronauts Alan Shepard and Ed Mitchell were practicing a series of simulated moon landings; while the third member of the crew - Stuart Roosa - was similarly occupied in his own mock command ship.

From the Middle East - Cairo comes a report that Egypt has now placed its armed forces - on full emergency alert. This - we are told - in preparation for a possible termination of the current cease-fire, which is scheduled to expire, unless extended - week from Friday.
