The United States rejects the suggestion - that we discontinue H-bomb tests. Soviet Russia has made the proposal - now India. Yesterday, U.N.Delegate Krishna Menon called upon both Russia and America - to cancel out all further experiments with H-bombs.

Today, Secretary of State John Foster Dulles said
emphatically that

now Our policy will not be changed - until there; a sound

agreement on disarmament, with safeguards against atomic war.

That we must retain our position in the forefront of

and that

atomic development. And H-bomb tests - are needed for that.

In Washington, the Russian proposal is considered - a phoney. Moscow scheming to halt American atomic progress - until Russian scientists can catch up.

The Western Big Three, today, presented a resolution - condemning Israel for that attack on Syrian outposts. Near - the Sea of Galilee. Mr The United States, Great Britain and France - telling the Security Council of the United Nations, that the raid was a "flagrant violation" of the Palestine truce. At the same time, the Western powers note that the Syrians had been interfering with Israeli fishing boats on the Sea of Galilee.

Today's resolution is not so strong - as the one presented by Soviet Russia. Which would threaten Israel with economic sanctions - even military action. Israel - called upon to pay compensation to Syria.

The Western condemnation does not recommend either sanctions or compensation.

All of which is accompanied - by news of more shooting along the Gaza Strip. Egyptian and Israeli forces - blazing away at each other with mortars and automatic weapons.

Baghdad - requesting the withdrawal of the Egyptian Military

Attache. Called - personna non grata. The reason is not

given - but, undoubtedly, it concerns the Baghdad Pact. Opposed

by Egypt - Iraq a member. The two Arab countries -at odds over

the pro-Western alliance.

New riots - on the island of Cyprus. British troops hurrying to the scene - to suppress the disturbance. So how were they greeted?

With cheers - a friendly welcome. The rioters - rushing up to the British soldiers, and shaking hands with them.

The answer is - they were Turks. Reminding us there a Turkish minority on Cyprus. Most of the people - Greeks, agitating for union with Greece. The Turks - opposing this.

Eleven days ago, a Turkish police sergeant was honored by the British - for the courageous part he played in suppressing anti-British riots. byxthex@recksxxYesterdayx he was granted a decoration - bestowed by Queen Elizabeth. Then, yesterday, the Turkish police sergeant - was killed by antixEritish terrorists.

Today, all Turkish stores were closed in Cyprus - as a sign of mourning. Anti-Greek riots -- breaking out.

But the British are preserving law and order, and sent military forces to check the angry Turks. Who greeted the anti-riot squads - with a friendly enthusiasm.

In London, today, a familiar figure was observed going into a familiar place. Sir Winston Churchill - entering
Number Ten Downing Street. Residence of Prime Minister, of
which he was a tenant for so long.

Churchill, having a confidential talk with Sir

Anthony Eden. His own successor as Frime Minister. Eden Churchill's protege'.

For dallying along, and letting things ride. "Dithering", the British call it.

We hear that Churchill arranged the meeting today to discuss policies, in the face of the criticism. Also, to
make it evident that Eden has the support of Churchill.

Four expeditions already, and they be to be joined by the from Australia, New Zealand, Japan, Norway, Chile, Argentina and the United of South Africa. Eleven countries establishing themselves - down in that region of the South Pole. So no wonder there's danger of over-crowding.

The reason - international geophysical year. The whole world joining - in a concerted scientific study of this planet of ours. One important center for

The geophysical year - set for next year, and Nineteen Fifty-Eight. But a lot of time is required for preparations in the Antarctic.

At the Connecticut Light and Power Company, today, automobiles entering the Milford plant - were examined with a Geiger counter! Seeking signs - of radioactivity.

They were looking for a capsule - a small cylinder, an inch andthree-eights in length. Filled - with radioactive cobalt. As deadly - as the fall-out from a hydrogen bomb.

Yesterday, this was being used in taking X-ray pictures of piping - installed in plant. Testing - the welding. The cylinder of radioactive cobalt - left hanging on a string, attached to a pipe.

Then - it was missing. And the search was on - for the lethal atomic stuff.

Today, the Geiger counter was poked into some sixty automobiles - and nothing happened. Then up drove a plant worker - Benjamin Zawacki (pronounced as - sky). The moment the Geiger counter came near his automobile, clackity, clackity, risk

clack. The car hot - with radioactivity. The missing capsule -

found in the glove compartment.

Zawacki, most astonished - explained. Yesterday afternoon, he saw the cylinder dangling from a string. -- end he heed the string to tie up some cables, so he took the string - including the capsule of radioactive exp cobalt.

"It looked to me like an ordinary fitting," he explains.

"I put it in my pocket - and later into the series compartment of my car."

Today, they were testing Zawacki for a radioactivity.
toxisted to a radioactivity.
Also - three other plant employees, whom he was driving to work.

Here's a report - on the latest lunatic. The weather!

In Florida, today, vegetable farmers were plowing under thirteen thousand acres - of frost bitten tomatoes, beans, cold spell and squash. In Dade County - alone. And the rest still continues.

At Devil's Hill, North Carolina, the Mayor has asked for state aid - in protecting Exercise seaside cottages from high tides and raging surf. All along the coast - abnormal tides, rolling in. Washing out roads - and sweeping cottages away.

In the Middle West, a storm of sleet and rain moving in. In the Great Lakes area, highways - covered with
glazed ice.

In the Rocky Mountain states - warm weather.

Temperatures - twenty to twenty-five degrees above normal.

Though - the second week in January is usually the coldest in the year. Farmers reporting - their fruit trees are threatening to bud. And break out with flowers - much too early.

In Texas, the Baptist Church has asked its members to pray for rain. Three-fourths of Texas - in the grip of a drought. Which extends up into Kansas and Nebraska, with a menace of dust storms.

On the Pacific coast, a plague of - rain. It's been raining ever since the first of the year - and the wet spell/ still continues.

Yes, the weather - has gone crass wacky.

In St. Louis - a "shocking" state of affairs. The city - "electrified". By - one shock after another.

St.Louis has been having - dry weather. Today, the fortieth day < of an atmosphere < almost without moisture.

Normally, St.Louis has a damp sort of climate. But now - the reverse.

The result - an exaggeration of a phenomenon you'll find, in cities where the air is dry. Like Denver, for example, with its high altitude. Static electricity - all over the place. You walk along the carpet of a hotel corridor, and then touch the metal door-knob - and there's a spark, and you get a shock.

Today, a housewife in St.Louis said: "I just walked over to see if the radiator was warm. When I touched it, I got a jolt that set me back on my heels."

And - pity the poor carpet layers. They work up - a heavy voltage. Today, one St.Louis carpet layer complained:
"You don't even have to touch a metal surface. I got a big

spark off my elbow, yesterday - just walking close to a metal door-frame." Everybody in St. Louis - sparkling!
