From London comes the story today of another record long-distance flight. British aviatriz Sheila Scott becoming the first woman pilot - ever to fly non-stop all the way from Cape Town to London, a distance of some seven thousand miles.

Sheila Scott setting out from South Africa - on Sunday. Her single-engine Commanche - an American built plane - flying the length of Africa - including through a sandstorm over the Sahara., In this storm her automatic pilot was first to go out. Then her short wave radio.

Next her automatic compass - then followed by a blocked fuel pipe over Libya - and later she was buffeted by a big electric storm over France.

But kex the condainted Sheila pressed on, until she touched down at London- after two days plus nearly twenty hours in the air.
