## GOOD EVENING EVERYBODY:

At the U.N. Italian Ambassador Ortona said: "The issue of the $U-2$ would seem to have lost most of its significance - in view of the performance of the satellite."

Which expresses a fairly general opinion - at the world organization, following - the launching of the Midas, our "Spy-in-the sky", now in orbit.

Today the scientists received a stream of signals
from the satellite - with its infra red eye, designed for the purpose of spotting the launching of missiles or the touching off of atomic explosions.

The Midas - to be followed by the Samos, another
type of man-made moon - with apparatus for photographing the ground. To do the same kind of reconnaissance job as the U-2. The goal - a whole system of satellites for aerial inspection.

It seems surethat the Soviet resolution condemning the United States, for aggression - will lose out. But,
if so - Gromyko says he' ll take the case from the Security Council to the General assembly of the U.N.

President Eisenhower's address, tonight, will be beamed repeatedly for the benefit of the people in Soviet Russia. Put on the air - five times, tomorrow; in Russian. Also in other languages that are spoken - in the vast realiu of the Soviets.

Moscow has reverted, now - to jamming, trying to keep the people in Russia from receiving the western broadcasts. But we will try to get through - with tonight's Eisenhower declaration to the American public, explaining - the position of the United States in that affair of the $U-2$ and the summit collapse.

Today, they finally flew out - that American C-47 transport plane, which got lost - and landed in the territory of Communist East Germany. The nine Americans aboard - made prisoners by the Reds.

Yesterday, the Russian command said come and $\quad$ get them. Releasing - plane and prisoners. The C-47 --dalittle damaged. So the idea was - to fly it out. With the Americans - who had been turned loose.

But it was a tough job to get the big lumbering transport plane out of the wheat field - where it had landed. Rain, fog and wind - intervening. However, at last, they were able to take off. The c-47 -- flying to an American base at Wiesbaden.

The Executive Committee of the New York State

Republican Organization - adopted a resolution, today. Urging N.Y. that the/GOP delegation go to the National Convention uncommitted. Which, of course, means - not pledged to Vice-President Nixon. Leaving the possibility - of (backing Governor Rockefeller for the presidency.

This is a victory - for the State Republican Chairman, Judson Morehouse, Who has been arguing - that Nelson Rockefeller must not be ruled out of the prestdential race. A contention who have been opposed by a number of up-state Republican leaders./backing Nixon. They - wanting a pro-Nixon declaration. In advance of the New York State primary - on June Seventh.

Today, the Executive Committee was in session with Governor Rockefeller attending. So now the Committee decision. Urging a delegation - uncommitted. In addition to which there's a move to make Nelson Rockefeller - the New York State favorite son.

Later, Governor Rockefeller made a declaration - that
he would accept a draft for the Republican nomination. Telling a news conference - that he will not be an active candidate. But that he would accept the prize - if it were offered.

He said he believed, personally, that Vice-President Nixon will be nominated. To which he added five significant words. "But," said he, "these are changing times."

Obviously, there is an idea that the political
situation might possibly change, Ih such fashion that, at the Republicanconvention - there might be a revolution in favor of Nelson Rockefeller.

However, it can be argued - that Nixon has the sewed nomination already ksued up. Yesterday, he gained fifty-four delegate votes from Tennessee and Florida; Now - pledged to him. Giving him a total of seven hundred and twenty-two.

Some pledged - others favoring Nixon. Six hundred and sixty-six needed - for the nomination. So a lot of delegates Will have to change their minds - if the Vice-President is to be stopped.)

In earthquake stricken southern Chile - nine volcanoes in eruption. Seven of them - old ones, long dormant; Now \# pouring forth streams of lava - some exploding with giant cones of brilliant flame. Two new volcanoes - bursting out of the ground on the shores of the lake. Hurling out - the water of the lake. Sending a flood - surging down the San Pedro River.

Along that stretch of the coast, the ground is constantly shaking. Chilean scientists declare that, between the forty-eighth and fifty-fourth parallels of latitude - the $T$ face of the earth is changing. A new look - for mountains and seacoast.

Here's a shocker in the news - about the American flag. The very reverse of saying - "long may it wave." The Star Spangled Banner - sold for making dresses and curtains. Even scrub rags.

An American traveler saw this in Haiti - and informed Congressman Charles Porter of Oregon about it. The Congressman putting in an inquiry to the State Department in Washington. Now getting a reply - from Assistant Secretary of State William Macomber. Who says - yes, it's true. Adding, a New York City exporter - shipped quantities of American flags to Haiti, \% be used in a way - humiliating to Americans.

The key to it all - the admission of the fiftieth state to the Union, Hawaii. Putting fifty stars - in the flag. The previous flags, with forty-eight and forty-nine stars more or less obsolete. Although the use of the older flags remains legal and proper. But there's no demand for them, and flag manufacturers have a lot - they can't sell. These
