MITCHELL

Elsewhere in Washington - a meeting of the National District Attorney's association; hearing from - Attorney General John Mitchell; who says ~~that~~ the Administration will soon introduce legislation - aimed at restoring "fairness" to the courtroom.

Ultimate goals - said he: To make the court room, once again "a place where fact is determined - and innocence or guilt decided; rather than a place where fact is ~~obscured and justice frustrated,~~ through the triumph of sophistry over common sense."

Mitchell adding that he was referring to "the overwhelming attention to proceduralisms - almost all of it benefiting the accused; also, ~~"fatuous argument that~~ because Americans read newspapers and watch television - it is impossible ~~for us~~ to get impartial juries;" ~~also, "the interminable post-trial devices - which rob justice of any finality."~~

BOLSHOI

At the world ~~famous~~ famed Bolshoi theater in Moscow - a major address by Soviet Premier Kosygin; who said that Russia "has displayed a new important initiative -- by suggesting the start of negotiations" on mutual troop cut backs in Europe. Kosygin adding: "We are ready for such reductions - if, in fact, the Nato countries display a sincere position;" whereas the latter, up to now, said he - have merely succeeded in "frustrating progress."

JERUSALEM-CAIRO

In the Middle East - Jerusalem -- Israeli Premier Golda Meir addresses the Israeli parliament -- the Knesset; there asserting that the U S - holds the key to peace in the Middle East; adding that the U S must fulfill Israel's latest arms request - or risk a "great danger" of renewed hostilities; especially - said she - in view of that new Soviet Egyptian friendship treaty.

Meanwhile, Cairo was publishing today - the text of a front line speech by Egypt's President Anwar Sadat, who also said that the U S - must state clearly its position on the Middle East. If the U S supports Israel's occupation of our land - said he - "I will deal with it as a partner of Israel; but if it has other views let it state them." Sadat ~~was~~ adding: "The battle must be settled ^{as he put it} by the will of God ^{- the will of Allah -} in Nineteen Seventy One."

At Paris a three hour meeting today; Secretary of State William Rogers - conferring with Japanese Foreign Minister Kiichi Aichi; after which an announcement ^{regarding} ~~setting~~ the terms for the return of Okinawa to Japan ^{some time next year} ~~sovereignty in Nineteen Seventy~~
