From the President's Cost of Living Council - an order today rescinding wage controls for some ten per cent of the U. S. labor force; also, rescinding price schedules - previously covering a hundred and sixty-five industries; everything from wearing apparel - to movies. This the biggest single act of decontrol - since the start of the President's Phase Five economic program.

SUPREME COURT

From the U.S. Supreme Court - a couple of decisions today affecting public morals. In one

~~In the first~~ ^λ *the High Court upholding a New York zoning ordinance, ~~thereby~~ prohibiting a group of six single college students of mixed sex - from living together in the same house. The majority opinion observing that such a group does not comprise a single "family" - as required by law.*

The Supreme Court also upholding a Texas law - making it illegal for men to dress like women and vice versa. The majority noting that "an ineffective disguise" - could lead to a breach of the peace; but "an effective disguise" - could be even worse. This - said the court - "after an acquaintance is formed with the disguisee - and the true sex is disclosed when the friendship becomes amorous."
