In spite of a last minute appeal from President Ford, the House today joined the Senate - in banning all covert U S military aid to Angola.

The President saying anti-Soviet forces in Angola "will be destroyed" if they are denied western aid.

get involved in the Angolan war." Adding: "The

Congress has been burned before" - and has "no

desire to be burned again."

BUSH

The nomination of George Bush to head the

C I A was finally approved today by the Senate -

by a ^{vote} ~~victor~~ of sixty-four to twenty-seven. Bush's critics

^{were} claiming he was "too political." The majority

agreeing however, with Senator Baker of Tennessee -

who said: "George Bush is first and foremost - a

patriot - a great citizen."

HOUSE

A move by the House Intelligence Committee to publish its final report this Friday - was blocked today by a technicality on the House floor. Congressman Bauman of Maryland forcing a temporary delay - on the grounds the report contains secret and ~~secret~~ sensitive information which could hurt U S interests. Committee chairman Pike indicating however, ^{that} he'll try again next week; also, ~~saying he "abhors the fact, ^{that} the report~~ ~~has already been leaked to the press, but adding~~ ~~"there is no way on earth" he can find out who did it.~~

SENATE FOLLOW HOUSE

and become embarrassing." Helms adding: "There


were times when I felt quite lonely - that ~~is~~ I could

WHITE HOUSE

Israeli Prime Minister Yitzhak Rabin a guest today at the White House, ~~where he~~ was greeted by a warm "shalom - meaning "peace"; - from President Ford, ~~standing~~ bare-headed in the ~~midst of a steady~~ rain, ^{said} the President, ~~adding~~ "Let us seize this historic opportunity to translate hope into reality."

In response Rabin ~~saying~~: "According to ~~Jewish tradition main means blessing.~~" ~~Also,~~ pledging that Israel, "will do all that can reasonably be done" to achieve lasting peace in the Middle East.
