At the Olympic Games in Rome there was sudden tragedy on the opening day for athletic events. There were a few yesterday. Danish cyclist, Knud Enemark - dying in the middle of the race, from sunstroke. Rome - sweltering. And Rome really can be hot in August. The athletes were all feeling the heat. Knud Enemark succumbing to it.

He was in the hundred kilometer cycle race. That's about - sixty three miles. Shortly after the fifty mile mark he began slowing down, then to wobble - collapsing over his **kiky** bicycle, dead by the time they got him to a doctor.

The Danish cycling team immediately withdraw in tribute to their team mate. However the rest of the athletes from Denmark will continue in the competitions.

The first gold medal of the 1960 Olympics was won by the Italian cyclists.

And in the swimming trials, America's Chris Von Saltza set a new Olympic an record - for women, in the

HERTER

The American Secretary of State today referred to the Fremier of Cuba as a dictator. Secretary Herter, in addressing the Organization of American States - at San Jose, Costa Rica, pointed out that the people of Cuba have not been allowed to vote on their government. Castro, as the world knows, took over by force - claiming to represent the will of the people. He promised a free election, but has shown no signs of allowing one.

Turning to Castro's accusations against the United States - Secretary Herter invited his colleagues to set up an investigating Committee, the committee, to hold sessions - in both the United States and Cuba, then report back - to the O.A.S.

CONGO

The Premier of the Congo Republic today widened his indictment, naming - more opponents. He now includes the French - as well as the Belgians.

Lumumba, charges that the French in Brazzaville - are, cooperating with the Belgians, against him.
