**SENATE**

*After many months of delay, the Senate Intelligence Committee today issued the first of its planned series of reports on U.S. Intelligence operations. Report Number One - deals with overseas operations; and as expected, it cites a number of alleged misdeeds - which it blames mostly on "the Executive Branch generally and the President in particular." Also, it urges the adoption of Eighty-Seven major recommendations - aimed at establishing "a system of executive accountability, command and control."*

*The Senate panel stressed, however, that the CIA is "not out of control." Adding that U.S. intelligence agencies "have made important contributions to the nation's security - and generally have performed their missions with dedication and distinction." Further saying the "individual men and women serving America in difficult intelligence assignments - deserve the respect and gratitude of the nation."*

Secretary of State Kissinger, in Africa, <sup>today</sup> conferred

block armed efforts to achieve black rule in Rhodesia.

MOSCOW

Soviet Defense Minister Andrei Grechko - the victim of an apparent heart attack today in Moscow. Grechko the chief architect of the Soviet military machine - for nearly a decade. Once saying it would be "stupid" - to start an atomic war. <sup>also saying:-</sup> ~~But adding;~~ "The only war to fight to win is an atomic one - and that is what we shall be prepared for."

LISBON

Portuguese Socialists ~~were~~ declared ~~today the big~~ winners - in Portugal's first free legislative elections in fifty years. The Socialists claiming more than Thirty-Five Per Cent of the total vote - topping their nearest rivals, the left-of-center Popular Democrats, by Eleven Per Cent. But they failed, ~~of course~~ to win a majority - and whether they can form a ~~new~~ coalition government remains to be seen.

The Communists <sup>earned</sup> ~~by the way, coming~~ in a distant fourth in legislative balloting - trailing even the Portuguese conservatives.

SUPREME COURT

The U.S. Supreme Court ~~upheld~~<sup>upheld</sup> ~~today~~ the conviction of three Rockford, Illinois, women - for burning a U.S. flag during a war-protest nearly six years ago. The Illinois law under which they were originally convicted - now upheld by the Court - <sup>is</sup> similar to flag laws in other states, calling for ~~the~~ prosecution of anyone who "publicly mutilates, defaces, defiles or casts contempt upon" the flag - "whether by words or act."

## BALANCE

With the U.S. economy again surging ahead -

American exports last month were the greatest so far this year. ~~That's the good news. The bad news - in the fact~~
