Egypt has made a diplomatic protest - against a thing said by secretary of State John Foster Dulles, yesterday. When the Secretary remarked - that the Suez Canal was internationalized by treaty in Eighteen Eighty Eight.

Dulles adding, however - that, of course, Suez was Egyptian territory.

Hussein, called at the State Department, and presented - an oral complaint. Later, he told newsmen that the Cairo government had instructed him to deny the statement - that the Suez Canal was internationalized in Eighteen Eighty Eight.

"All historic facts and documents," declared the Ambassador,

"prove - the Suez Canal was never internationalized."

The military gestures of Britain and France were made the more emphatic, today - by the landing of French troops on the island of Cyprus. Military units - assigned to a joint British-French Army, assembled within striking distance of the Suzz Canal.

that the Council of the North Atlantic Treaty Organization
will meet on Wednesday. Which touches off speculation - that,
at the meeting, Britain may make arrangements to withdraw
some of its nato forces from Germany. For use in the Eastern
Mediterranean - if the Suez dispute flares into violence.

Reports from London declare that British-Egyptian relations have - "gravely" deteriorated. British newspapers



are accusing Egypt of imposing a "reign of terror" on Britons living in the land of the Nile. Which follows - the arrest of three Britons, and the expulsion of two British diplomats on charges of espionage.

Today, Britain struck back by declaring two members of the Egyptian Embassy in London - personna non grata. Giving them - seventy-two hours to leave London.

FOLLOW SUEZ

Violence, meanwhile, has broken out on Cyprus again. The anti-British underground - attacking police outposts. Two British soldiers - wounded.

This follows the end of a truce - declared by the insurgents. Monday night, they called off the armistice, and Cyprus again has the familiar story of hit and run raids.

ADD FOLLOW SUEZ

Tonight a British supply ship struck a mine in the harbor of Nicosia. No lives lost - not much damage.

But the mine was planted by the Cypriot insurgents.

Indicating a new type of terrorism.

STOCKS

The drop of prices in Wall Street is attributed to the Suez Canal crisis. A wave of selling - precipitated
by the Suez news. And - by word of a long, secret conference

questionaire. And here's the result. The psychologist
putting it in terms of family relations.

President Eisenhower appears - as a "father image."

It is, declares Dr. Farber, as if Eisenhower is the good and just father, the kind you would like to have had. Not the **marketxme* smartest man in the world - but strong and dependable."

Adlai Stevenson - another kind of image, a capable, intelligent man, with a sense of humor. But, says the psychologist - with "no particular appeal for the common man."

He puts it in these words: "Stevenson appears like the father of the boy next door, who seems to know all sorts of things and makes jokes. But - whom you don't know so well, and with whom you feel shy and a little unsure."

What about Nixon? Well, the pre psychological poll shows - that he can arouse "acute dislike." The psychologist eplaining" "Nixon appears like the brother - who, though he has no more ability than you, gets ahead of you."

Senator Kefauver doesn't figure in the study - not having been nominated when the survey was made.
