British Air Force and Naval jet e -- pounding the broken vessel with thousand-pound bombe -- setting it afire. When the bomber were finished -- R.A.T. fighters dumping fuel from their wing ip tanks $-i^{-}$into the surrounding sea. Feeding the inferno in an effort to consume the thousands of tons of messy oil -- still oozing from the ship.

Within minutes -- the flames enveloping an
area roughly mile-and-half in diameter. Eyewitnesses
calling it a "sea of flames" -- with thick black smoke billowing thousand e of feet into the sky.

## KATZENBACH

Some six hundred of the nation's leading police officials and criminologists -- were on Mand today in

So much so -- says the Agriculture Department -- that more than a allion acres of valuable farmiand were damaged by winter winds; with total soil erosion -- roughly four times that of the winter before.

Hardest hit -- sections of Texas and eastern Colorado;
also Kansas. One of the nation's most productive .- wheat
growing regions; with some areas -- reporting only traces of moisture since last Fall.

Last week a major dirt storm swept over the Kansas- 9 Texas-Colorado area; sending great clouds of topsoil -swirling into the sky to a reported altitude -- of some twenty thousand feet.

## NEN DELHI FOLLOW GREAT PLAIMS

On the same subject -- only more so -- from Mew Jelhi;
a waring today thatindia's great drought is now well into its second year, with no relief in sight. Bringing the threat of food shortages and possible famine even worse this year than last.

This gloomy outlook appears in a report to the Indian Parliament from Food Minister Jagjivan Ram; who says conditions are already "extremely difficult" in the

Central Indian states of Bihar and Uttar Pradesh. Cortain to get worse -- said he -- unless the government can come up with about tweive million tons -- of life-giving grain.
