The xnewsxis xia x the xnew fragments of the United Press, prognosticating the strategy - Truman versus Kefauver. Which, says he, is a number one aspect behind the scenes. H.S.T. - as a possible "king-maker".

Of course, it looks like Stevenson - on an early ballot. Particularly - as Kefauver has withdrawn in favor of Stevenson. But, it is known - that former President Truman does not like - either Stevenson or Kefauver. He wrote as much in his "Memoirs". And, some weeks ago, expressed his opposition to Kefauver - all over again. So, says Lyle Wilson - if Truman sees a chance, he'll try to bring about the nomination of

Kefauver, having declared for Stevenson, is quoted as remarking: "Truman will have a heck of a time being 'king-maker' now." But - he still may try.

The strategy would revolve around - the racial rights issue. Right now, the Democratic high command has it all arranged for Adlai Stevenson to be nominated - as a moderate. And - for the Party platform to have a moderate plank on racial segregation. Thereby - keeping the Southern states in line. The Truman-Harriman combination - to upset that, if possible.

On Thursday of this week, the former President will be at a Convention Headquarters in Chicago - to discuss matters with the Platform Committee. When, if things look right, he will start working on that explosive point - the Supreme Court decision, outlawing racial segregation in schools. Which has the South - in a state of semi-rebellion.

Then, if things develop, the Harriman people will put up a fight in the Platform Committee - next week. Accusing Stevenson - of straddling on the question of racial rights.

Then, upon being out-voted in the Committee, they'll take a minority report onto the Convention floor - and put up a battle. Hoping that some blazing oratory on the subject of racial rights will stampede the Convention. Overthrowing - the policy of moderation, and blocking Stevenson.

That, according to the U.P. correspondent, would seem to be the only chance of bringing about the nomination of Harriman - with H.S.T. as "king-maker".

DEMOCRATIC PLATFORM

The Democratic National Chairman has given a bit of advice to the writers of the platform - to be adopted at Chicago. Chairman Butler counsels them - to avoid any mention of that controversial decision by the Sypreme Court,/outlawing racial segregation in schools. The toughest job for the platform writers is - the plank on racial rights. Should they, or should they not - bring out a proviso, calling for government enforcement of the Supreme Court decision? Chairman Butler says - no. Advocating - the Stevenson brand of "moderation." Something - to keep the South in line.

In Chicago, today, Chairman Butler addressed the Platform Committee, one-hundred-and-eight members - at its organization meeting. Later, he told the United Press, the stand he is taking. Declaring - he does not believeit's up to a political party to endorse a Supreme Court ruling. "Any decision of the Supreme Court on any subject," were the words he used - in arguing that the Democratic platform should not mention the outlawing of racial segregation in schools.

SEGREGATION follow DEMOCRATIC PLATFORM

In the South, meanwhile, there's a widespread move - to eliminate the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People. Which organization - is leading the campaign against racial segregation. Tonight, the Attorney General of Georgia stated - that he will introduce a measure in the State Legislature - to the curb, N.A.A.C.P. Alabama, Mississippi, Louisiana, and South Carolina have already taken steps - cracking down on the organization. Now, Georgia proposes similar concerted action all over the South.

MCCARTHY

Q Loud blast - hurled at Harold Stassen, for his Eisenhower-Herter campaign. The cannonade - fired by Senator Joseph McCarthy of Wisconsin. Who gives his own interpretation of the Stassen maneuvers - to stop the Eisenhower-Nixon ticket.

McCarthy says it all stems from what he calls -"an over-powering ambition to become president." He denounces HEE Harold Stassen as a leader of Republican "Left Wingers". And says - the scheme works this way: - /

If the Eisenhower-Nixon ticket is defeated in the election, the "Left Wingers" will blame Nixon. When enfort more Stassen will be hailed - as the man who called the turn. Then, as the successful prophet, he'll be in line for the G.O.P. nomination in Mineteen Sixty.

McCarthy and Stassen were political allies, at one time. But that, as you can judge - is a thing of the past. They've been political enemies for years. STEEL

U. S. Steel announces a hike in prices - following the settlement of the steel strike. The Company says the new three year agreement with the Union will raise the labor costs of the steel industry by a total of more than one billion, three hundre million dollars.

A raise in steel prices had been expected. Most observers that been thinking, there would be an increase of ten or twelve dollars a ton. The hike, however, is less - a price increase of eight dollars and fifty cents a ton. PSpokesmen for the industry say - that U.S.Steel is "absorbing" some of the increase of the labor cost. The Company, trying to lessen the inflationary effect - of an increasing cost of many products products using steel.

It's expected that the other Companies, resuming production after the strike, will follow the lead of U.S.Steel.

SUEZ CANAL

The warlike gestures in the Mediterranean still continue. Britain - sending a second aircraft carrier to those disturbed waters. A third large carrier - to steam from the harbor of Portsmouth to the Mediterranean, tomorrow.

France has a powerful naval unit, on the alert, at the Mediterranean port of Toulon, ready to sail on a few nours' notice. And the United States has warships cruising around the Mediterranean. Powerful units of the Sixth Fleet, including an aircraft carrier, sailing from Naples. But these American movements are called "routine maneuvers".

On the Egyptian side - new support from other Arab countries. Iraq - issuing a strong endorsement for the Egyptian nationalization of the Suez Canal. In London, today, fear was expressed that Iraq, too - might go into the nationalization business. Maybe - seize British oil properties in Iraq. There's apprehension, in fact, for all the billion dollar oil developments in Arab countries. Such as, for example, Arabian-American Oil with its immense resources of petroleum in Saudi Arabia.

However, the conservative opinion in London minimizes the alarming talk. The belief being - that the new stand assumed by the government of Iraq is, largely, for domestic policy. The purpose - to cool off anti-Western Arab nationalism.

In Cairo, today, Premier Nasser held an emergency Cabinet meeting to decide - whether or not to accept the invitation to an international conference on the Suez Canal question. Nasser undecided, apparently - on whether or not Egypt will **and** send a delegation to a London parley.

Thus far, nine countries have accepted invitations. to the world conference: Egypt, of course, has not yet replied nor has India. Most important of all, perhaps - Moscow has not yet replied. Saying - whether or not Soviet Russia will participate in the plans to internationalize the Suez Canal.

ADD SUEZ CANAL

President Eisenhower was in conference with Secretary of State **Summer** Dulles today - on the question of Suez. The White House telling us - the President is keeping in "constant touch" with the State Department. Receiving - the latest reports on the crisis.

CYPRUS

Nicosia', the capitol and all cities on the island of Cyprus - in utter darkness. All electrical power - cut off.

The sudden darkness occurred - immediately following a radio program. The Cypriot sweetheart of an assassinated Cypriot policeman - broadcasting, called the leader of the Cypriot underground - a murderer, and challenged the terrorists - saying she was not afraid of them. Even though - they might try to kill her, too.

And then - for 45 minutes, darkness - Electric power - cut off. No doubt sabotage.

JAPAN

Estra

Japan and Soviet Russia have broken off talks concerning the Kurile Islands. The Japanese insisting - that Russia has no right whatever to have possession of two small islands near the Japanese coast.

In Moscow, today, Tokyo Foreign Minister Shigemitsu argued this with Soviet Foreign Minister Shepilov. But Shepilov replied: "To talk further about the territorial problem would mean nothing more than to prolong the talks fruitlessly."

So that would seem to be that - in the long drawn out negotiations to work out a peace treaty between Japan and Soviet Russia. The two countries, still at war, in a technical sense.

HIROSHIMA

At a city in Japan, today - a great flock of doves rose fluttering in the air. Five hundred birds, released at Hiroshima - as doves of peace.

Part of commemoration of the eleventh anniversary of the first atomic bomb used in warfare. At exactly eight fifteen A.M., the hour of the explosion, sirens wailed - and two hundred thousand people bowed their heads. In silent prayer for the sixty thousand victims of the atomic blast at Hiroshima.

The hope was - that the fateful event would never be repeated on this earth. Hope symbolized - by the winging flight of five hundred doves of peace.

In Budapest, capital of Red Hungary, the U.S.Minister is being transferred - to a post in Ecuador. So, an American military transport plane flew to Budapest - to pick him up and take him to Bremen, where he will board ship.
