According to the United Press dispatch from Amman this has strengthened the hand of the King. Adding the 30,000 desert warriors to the twenty thousand regulars of the Arab Legion built up and trained by the Englishman, Glubb Pasha. Tonight the Arab Legionaires in battle

Therefore - since Britain is vulnerable to atomic attack, she must have her own atomic arsenal. The Defense Minister going on to say that the Macmillan government is only being "realistic" in its concern for the defense of Britain.

The Air Force confirms the rumor that it will have its first combat plane powered by atomic energy - in about seven years.
