any more street demonstrations. The Reverend Maurice Dawkins, arguing that the Civil Rights Movement is past its preliminary phase, and should move on - to the next phase. Namely - voter registration.

As a clergyman, he wants the drive to be
handled - through the churches. All negro pastors,
being urged to see - that their parishioners register to
cast ballots in November. As for demonstrations, "We
have no time to waste on demonstrations" - says the

Los Angeles Minister.
