on wage hikes, to be off-set by a cutback in income taxes;
also, urging a fifty percent cut in ^{present} ~~current~~ taxes on basic
consumer goods - with an increase in taxes on liquor,
cigarettes and gasoline. Chancellor of the Exchequer Dennis
Healy saying: "The tide has now turned - but the extent
of recovery" is dependent on these measures.**

**Meanwhile, the British pound - after another
plunge on foreign exchange markets; rebounded - apparently
in response to the new government program.**
