A new agreement -- abolishing the old Panama

Canal treaty of Nineteen Oh Three. Announced simultaneously

today by President Johnson in Washington -- and President

Robles in Panama City.

The new pact - said me Johnson - one that will "effectively recognize Panama's sovereighty" over the Canal Zone. But including terms - "under which there might be constructed across Panama -- a new sea level canal."

The joint announcement - capping negotiations that began after the canal zone riots of last year, In which twenty-three were killed - including four U.S. soldiers.

Incidentally, no decision yet - as to whether that sea level canal will be built in Panama; Or whether somewhere else in Central America. It all depends on studies - still under way.

From Qui Nhon in Viet Nam - news today of what appears to be a tremendous government victory.

South Vietnamese soldiers - said to have killed more than six hundred Viet Cong, In a pitched battle along a highway - just wenty miles from a major American marine base.

The dead - part of an attack force that attempted

but

to over run a government outpost failed n and was then

caught in a pincers movement between two government relief

columns, U.S. and Vietnamese air support - a major

factor in the tide of battle.

The victory all the more significant -- in that it foiled what was apparently the Communists' first strike, In a long-rumored full-scale assault on the coastal plains - during the monsoon season just ahead.

At the United Nations - a Russian demand today that the United States - end its so-called "aggression" in Viet Nam. At once - with no preliminary conditions. Just pack up - and get out.

Because - said Soviet delegate Gromyko - U.S. intervention in Viet Nam - is a clear xiek violation of the Geneva agreements of Nineteen Fifty-Four. No matter how much we now pretend to - "talk of peace."

From U.S. Ambassador Arthur Goldberg - this reply:— The Russian tirade - said he - "merely a restatement of old positions - which have never been accepted by any U N body."

"Everyone" he went on - "everyone knows the war in Viet Nam - was caused by North Viet Nam's military interference. And no amount of rhetoric - can change that fact."

The UN General Assembly decided later today

to hold a new debate on the seating of Communist China

and with a show of reluctance also agreed to consider

Peking's treatment of the people of Tibet.

## KASHMIR

That Peace in Hindustan seems anything but secure, as India and Pakistan today exchanged repeated accusations -- that each has violated the U.N. ceasefire.

The Indian Government at New Delhi -- asserting that

Pakistani forces have crossed the truce-line -- in at

least two places, and that pro-Pakistani guerrillas -
have killed eighty-three Indian soldiers, in a new flare-up

of fighting -- in Kashmir.

And there's a Pakistani charge that India has violated the truce -- at least four times since it went into effect on Wednesday. The latest an artillery attack -- on Pakistani outposts near Lahore.

A tragic -- and perhaps needless loss of life today,
in a blazing fire -- at a top-secret U.S. Navy Cummunications
Center near Tokyo. Japanese firemen -- at first barred
from the scene were finally admitted two hours later -- when
the flames were totally out of control.

Anather discretency Should be

Result: Twelve U.S. servicemen -- killed in the blaze and fourteen others -- seriously injured. The Japanese say they could have saved some -- if they hadn't been locked out.

Nevertheless there is a compelling weason why they were denied entry. The communications center is said to be the largest in Japan; and a key link between Washington and the U.S.

Seventh Fleet -- in the waters off Vietnam.

Another disastrous flood, - reported today-from

Morocco, A flash-flood - caused by heavy rains, That

swept through a crowded market place in the village of

Khemis Nagua - a hundred miles south of Casablanca.

Human bodies, dead cattle and debris - strewn for miles, As the flood-wave raced across the unobstructed coastal plain -- on to the sea. The toll: At least seventy-five dead, more - kinking missing.

The nature of Heaven and Hell - focal point

of debate today at the Vatican, As the Ecumenical Council

continued its discussion of the document - "on the church

in the modern world."

A Belgian Bishop, for one, challenging the old church view - of a paradise in the sky. This - said he -in totally "out of date in an interplanetary age." More to the point - he went on - the church might well consider the possibility - that there are living intelligent creatures somewhere up there-for out there in Space, on planetare for distant galaxies.

By contrast - an Italian Bishop charged that the document is faulty - because it "ignores the presence of evil." Said he: "We should remind men - of the devil in the modern world."

From Fort Worth - the story today of an attempted suicide. That failed - because of an accident in World War Two.

The principal character - a thirty-eight year old Texan - with problems bigger than he could handle.

So distraught - that he finally fired a bullet into his head.

Under normal cock circumstances - a shot that would have killed him instantly.

But somehow - he didn't die. And when doctors probed the wound - they found the bullet imbedded in a steel po plate. The plate inserted in his head following a service accident - some twenty years ago.

A professional Marine who fought back from dishonor -was a guest today at the White House and thanked the
President personally.

Master Sergeant Carl Buck of Seattle, was a veteran of twenty-two years in the Marines, when he was accused thirteen years ago -- of stealing five hundred dollars worth of chevrons. Subsequent conviction -- resulting in a bad conduct discharge.

But he never stopped proclaiming his innocence. And early this month -- the President was convinced. Buck getting back his rank and his uniform -- and full Presidential pardon. Said he: "I'm proud to be an American -- and I'm proud to be a Marine."
