contrary to past policy -- the United States joining in the "aye" vote -- although with reservations. U.S.

Ambassador Arthur Goldberg stating agreement with the proposal-"in principle." But adding, in effect, that the final decision of whether we participate or not -- will depend largely on the future actions of Red China.

President Johnson today announced plans for personal talks -- with British Prime Minister Harold Wilson. Either in Washington or Texas -- on December Seventeenth. The day after Wilson -- is scheduled to address the United Nations.

This the first face-to-face meeting between the two
men -- since last December. And it's expected to cover a wide
range of issues -- from the war in Viet Nam to rebellion in
Rhodesia.

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Nam. With a full regiment of some two thousand enemy troops -besieging the provincial capital of Tuy An, A coastal
village on the South China Sea -- about two hundred and fifty
miles northeast of Saigon.
