Secretary of State Kissinger was again bitterly critical of Congress - in a speech today at the University of Wyoming, at Laramie. Dr. Kissinger accusing Congress of 'dismanteling and demoralizing - our intelligence services. Also, saying the lawmakers have so restricted U S Foreign Policy - they have left us virtually no option assest except "to retreat, to become an isolated fortress island in a hostile and turbulent global sea; awaiting the ultimate confrontation - with the only response we will not have denied ourselves, massive retaliation."

Dr. Kissinger therefore, water urging a greater ground swell of public support - so the Ford Administration can act with assurance and speak with confidence - on behalf of all Americans. If not - we face the "danger of progressively losing the ability to shape events," said he. Adding that "a great nation
