"The mills of the God's grind slowly" so the old saying goes. And so too the Senate Watergate hearings. Today in their thirty-third day they were going off in a dozen different directions and along the way - producing a few heated confrontations. One dealing with a memo to witness HR Haldeman; a memo stating that violent and obscene dem demonstrations would be staged - at a joint appearance by President Nixon and Evangelist Billy Graham. Senator Weicker of Connecticut noting that Haldeman had written "good" at one point - and "great" at another. Demanding to know "exactly what kind of mentality is in the White House" - that would do such a thing.

Haldeman's response - when he was finally

permitted to answer - an attempt to explain the

circumstances. He would have welcomed such a

protest - said he - because the American people would

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thus come to understand that such demonstrations were organized - planned and evil; and not the casual,
minor, "off the cuff" event - such as reporters up to
then had portrayed them.

Under questioning by Senator Montoya of

New Mexico - Haldeman also discussed the White House

"enemies list", saying this was an attempt - to screen

potential White House guests and entertainers - and

thereby eliminate those - who might pose "any

security threat or any potential embarrassment."

As such - said he - it is similar to the po-called

"anathema list" - which existed under the Johnson

administration.

At the Pentagon - a ceremony today marking
the swearing in of General George S. Brown - as new
Air Force Chief of Staff. The main speaker - Defense
Secretary James Schlesinger; also taking this occasion to attack recent Congressional cuts in military
appropriations.

Sould Schlesinger; saying: "We're into the post-war follies." Adding: "It's now fashionable - as it has been in the past - to attempt to disestablish the defense "Bet; headled establishment." But "it's only "an enchanting illusion" said he to think "that you can cut into fat without cutting into muscle."

Washington again - legal maneuver aimed

at forcing an immediate bombing halt in Cambodia *

was rejected today by Supreme Court Justice Thurgood

Marshall. Marshall saying: "I would exceed my legal

authority - were I, acting alone, to grant this application!

The same appeal now headed for Justice William O.

Douglas - who is vacationing in Goose Prairie,

Washington.

From President Nixon and Japan's Prime

Minister Tanaka - a joint communique today; marking

the completion - of two days of talks. The President

and the Prime Minister expressing "their strong hope
for a stable and lasting piece in Indo-China through

scrupulous implementation - of the Paris agreement "on

Viet Nam. Also, reaffirming "their resolve - to assist

in the rehabilitation of Indo-China."

The communique going on to say that

President Nixon will visit Japan - before the end of

1974; with Emporer Hirohito to return the call - at a

later date, as yet unspecified.

The founding father of Communist East

Germany - dead today at Liepnith in East Germany.

Die-hard Stalinist Walter Ulbricht- the man who built

the infamous Berlin Wall; who helped to make sure 4

that Germany would remain divided in the wake of World

War Two. But the man who also helped to rebuild
his own East Germany; making it the world's - ninth

greatest industrial power. Now - the victim of a heart

attack.

Walter Ulbricht - age eighty.

At Tehran and throughout Iran - an official

"oil day" by government proclamation; including parades
public speaches - singing and dancing and so on.

Iran, henceforth, total control over its own oil industry; also, guaranteeing an extra half billion - in annual income. The Iranian oil fields - currently accounting for roughly 10% of total world production.

five men and six women; hoping to sail their tiny craft

across the Atlantic - all the way to Mexico's Yucatan

Peninsula. Mexican adventurer Santiago Genoves - who

human harmony."
