Senator Bayh of Indiana and Senator Young of Ohio - the latest to spare convention-watchers from unnecessary oratory. Better still, Democratic Chairman John

Bailey moving today - to cut out demonstrations entirely.

War news from Vietnam tells today of a US

armored assault - to the very tox threshold of the

Communist north. With American tanks heading an

allied advance halfway across that DMZ -- all the

way to the official boundary between the two Vietnams.

At the height of the battle - US tank gunners, firing

point blank at enemy fortifications inside North Vietnam.

This in the first allied clean-up of the buffer zone -- in nearly five weeks. Also the bloodiest fighting in two months - for the enemy, at least.

With the US command setting Communist losses - at more than two hundred and eighty men; as against an initial allied death toll of only four -- next all of them South Vietnamese.
