Ike suffers another heart attack. The news flash late today - from Walter Reed Army Hospital in Washington.

Doctors calling former President Eisenhower's seventh heart seizure - in a word "serious." With the Doctors adding that it's still too early to appraise "the full consequences" of this latest attack.

For the nation's top democrats - all roads lead to

Chicago this weekend. Humphrey, McCarthy, McGovern and a host of others - all heading for the Windy City, where the Democrats first convention battle is set to begin bright and early Monday morning.

At the opening of credentials' committee hearings it is expected there will be challenges to delegations from at least fifteen states. McCarthy, for one, saying the credentials fight - could be one of the most important issues this year.

For Hubert Humphrey though -apparently
no such concern. The Vice President wending his way
through Pennsylvania today - the picture of strength
and confidence. Telling a crowd at Allentown -that
victory in America's war on poverty "will be the greatest
achievement of civilization." Telling another crowd at


Pittsburgh; "There's a whole surge of interest. $\xrightarrow{\prime \prime \prime}$ looks good for Hubert!"

No doubt, Humphrey buoyed in part - by the
withdrawal today of two more favorite son candidates

Senator Bayh of Indiana and Senator Young of ohio -
the latest to spare convention-watchers from unnecessary oratory. Better still, Democratic Chairman John

Bailey moving today - to cut out demonstrations entirely.

War news from Vietnam tells of a $U S$ armored as sault - to the very threshold of the Communist north. With American tanks heading an allied advance halfway across that $D M Z-$ all the way to the official boundary between the two Vietnams. At the height of the battle - U S tank gunners, wiring point blank at enemy fortifications inside North Vietnam.

This in the first allied clean-up of the
buffer zone -- in nearly five weeks. Also the bloodiest fighting in two months - for the enemy, at least. With the $U$ s command setting Communist losses - at more than two hundred and eighty men; as against an initial allied death toll of only four -- all of them South Vietnamese.

Meanwhile, the Texas White House - today restating President Johnson's official "hands off" policy. Press secretary George Christian saying: "As far as I know

- neither the White House nor anybody in the White House has had anything to do with the convention."

The cause of that tragic helicopter crash Wednesday near Disneyland - believed pinpointed today. Government air safety investigators in Washington saying one of the craft's main rotor blaxame blades apparently broke off in flight. Possibly the result of "a metal fatigue type failure of the blade spindle assembly."

Accordingly, the probers urging an immediate inspection of all such helicopters - before they leave the ground again.

At Prague - a final parley between

Czech Communist leader Dubcek and Romanian Communist Soorescu
leader Ceausescu. Followed by the signing of a new twenty year friendship pact between the two countries. Thin Emphasizing onceragain - their newfound independence from Soviet mastery.

Later Dubcek warning the Czechs against trying to obtain too much freedom too fast.

Asserting that "unity and alliance with the Soviet

Union" -- remains "the Alpha and the Omega of Czech foreign policy."

After months of comparative quiet - trouble again in Indonesia. Reports from Jakarta - telling today of an army purge in the Siliwangi District of West Java. Back in Jakarta - President Suharto was blaming ex-President Sukarno for the country's present economic plight, saying it will take at least another five years - to undo the damage.

This next - from Stockholm. Perhaps heralding the shape of things to come -in jet air travel. When a sexy blonde will announce over the cabin intercom: "Good morning, lad ladies and gentlemen-- this is your captain speaking."
