Although the full report is not yet available, the chief astronaut physician aboard the ship -- says they came through the flight in excellent condition. Even better than some of the pioneering Mercury astronauts -- who made much shorter flights.

As a result -- the space doctors are said to be "tremendously optimistic" -- about the feasability of prolonged flight through space.--To the moon -- and beyond.

The big news on Viet Nam - comes today from the State Department in Washington. The U S commander in the Far East - said to have han been given a green light for the first time, To commit American marines and paratrooper - to a major combat role in the Vietnamese war.

Until now - American ground forces were restricted to - "aggressive patrolling". This limited to the defense perimeters - around key U S air bases and port facilities.

The new role for U S fighting men - one of combat support for South Vietnamese forces - when and as needed, subject - to just two questifications. In the South Vietnamese military command - must request such assistance. And two U.S. troops must operate alongside South Vietnamese forces - and not on their own.

### VIET NAM FOLLOW STATE

Meanwhile, halfway around the world -- American warplanes today again blasted Red military targets - in the Communist North. While in the south - a series of sharp ground clashes, Ranging all the way from Da Nang - to the Mekong delta. U.S. troops said to have killed seventy-seven guerrillas - capturing twenty eight more. No American dead - in the wounded.

By unanimous vote - the Senate agreed today to divert twenty five million dollars - from US military aid to Latin America. The money to be used to help support that inter-American peace force - in the Dominican Republic.

Across Capitol Hill - the House Judiciary

Committee voted today to make it a federal crime - to kill

the President. Also, the Vice President or any other

government official - who is next in order of succession.

The penalty - death in the electric chair.

A young Cleveland woman - perilously close to death -- is gambling her life today - on a gambler. Here's the story:

The gambler - one James Toney. Shot and fatally wounded by his girl friend - following an argument over gambling losses. After his death - to Toney's kidney was removed - with the permission of his estranged wife, And later transplanted into the body - of the dying woman.

In any case - it's a long shot. Taking anywhere from two days to two weeks - to tell whether the transplant is successful - or not.

### MOROCCO

In Morocco -- Premier Ahmen Bahnini resigned today -- and King Hassan the Second immediately assumed full emergency powers.

The King's action -- in effect -- dissolving the parliament that refused to back Bahnini's bid -- for a broad national unity cabinet.

King Hassan is now expected to form his own personal cabinet; based on a promise of broad social reforms -- for the Moroccan poor. The latest government crisis is a direct result of the bloody riots by jobless workers; in Casablanca, Fez and Rabat -- earlier this year.

Rescue operations continued today - in the wake of that Yugoslavian coal mine explosion. The world's' fourth major mine disaster - in less than a month. So far - more than a hundred and twenty bodies recovered from below ground - with little hope of finding any more survivors. The final death toll - expected to reach about a hundred and sixty men.

Twenty five other miners miraculously escaping death - when they followed a fresh air current to a break in the rubble. Among them- a foreman who survived a similar blast in the same mine - thirty-one years ago.

The dead in that long ago accident - totaling a hundred and twenty seven men.

In Spain - fourteen airmen were killed today
in a mid-air collision. Near the Spanish Air Force base at Alcantarilla. Two German made junkers - crashing
together during a paratroop training exercise. Both
planes - plunging in flames. The first such accident in
at the Alcantarilla Air Base - in the eighteen years it has
been in existence.

This next - from Kuala Lumpur. The Federation of Malaysia - embroiled in another international crisis today. And for once - it has nothing to do with Sukarno.

This problem - maybe a bit more ticklish.

For it involves the question of who shall reign as "Miss Malaysia" - in the forthcoming Miss Universe Beauty Pageant.

The "Miss Malaysia" preliminary - set for this Level Saturday. But contestants, thrown into a tizzy today - by a government decree Porbidding the girls from parading in their swim suits - under penalty of the law. On the grounds - that it is against Malaysia's national religion of Islam - to exhibit any part of a woman's body.

This late report - from sponsors of the beauty pageant. If the ruling stands - "we have alternate plans" - say they. But just what - not disclosed.

What do you think? Could it be veils? Or will they settle for graceful Malay sarrays?

Two new records reported today - from Castro Cuba. The first - a record sugar crop - of six million tons. Announced personally by Fidel Castro - in a radio broadcast from a sugar mill in Oriente Province.

The second - a record for brevity - set by

Bastro himself. He spoke - for just seven minutes. As

compared with some of his earlier speeches - that have

ranged up to five and a half hours in length.
