In Washington -- the U.S. Supreme Court today reversed the Wineteen Sixty-two conviction of Texas financier Billie Sol Estes.

Because a part of his swindling trial -- was carried on television.

The admission of television cameras was based -- said the court -- on "a misconception of the rights of the press." The decision adding that "a defendant on trial -- is entitled to his ay in court -- not in a stadium -- or a nationwide arena."

This the first time that the high court has given such a decree on courtroom television. Up to now -- TV has been permitted freely in state courts of Texas and Colorado -- that is, permitted at the discretion of individual judges.
