The President also sent to Congress today - a message calling for the appropriation of three-and-a-half million more acres of wilderness land; "to help make sure" - said he - that "the world of nature is preserved - along with the world of man."

And later on, the appointment of a new twenty-member advisory committee - on the economic role of women.

Its main task - said the President - to ensure that women "have full equality of opportunity and freedom of choice to pursue their careers - whether they be in the home or outside the home."

WATERGATE

In Washington - a sudden halt today in the civil cases - filed in connection with the Watergate bugging incident. District Judge Charles Richey ordering a temporary end to the taking of depositions - after a lengthy conference with lawyers for both sides. "It is patently obvious" - said he - that the civil cases "cannot be tried before the election; and, therefore - he continued - today's action was necessary - to avoid prejudicing criminal proceedings.

From the U.S. Command in Saigon - another

Vietnam casualty report today; but this one - for the U.S.;

at least - the lowest of the entire war; with none killed
only seven wounded.

These figures comparing with South Vietnamese losses - of more than four hundred; and enemy losses - more than four thousand.

Meanwhile, South Vietnam's President Thieu
was returning from a two-day battlefield tour, Assuring

reporters that government forces - now have "the situation

in hand." Adding that they also have the "flexibility" - to

"handle" anything the Communists can now throw at them.

And then - a TV address. Thieu warning the

French - against interfering in Vietnam peace

negotiations. Further declaring that, indeed, it was

France - whose "traitorous and cowardly action" originally

"sold out Vietnam in collusion with the Communists." Thieu

adding that the memory of same - is truly "nauseating."

Paris again - another peace session; with William porter for the U.S. - again rejecting a Communist call for a tri-partite government in Saigon. Porter observing that "a quarter of a century of ruthless Communist fratricide - has made observers pardonably skeptical about professions of coexistence."
