**PRESIDENT FORD**

**For President Ford - a quick trip today to Langley, Virginia - where he installed George Bush as new head of the CIA . The President also taking this occasion to blast the leaking of official secrets - in an effort to discredit the agency. "The abuses of the past have been more than adequately described - and I am concerned about them" - said he; "but one thing is very, very certain. We can not improve this agency by destroying it."**

**In the same vein, George Bush saying: "I will not turn my back on the past - but emphasis now will be on the future." Adding, above all, "I am determined to protect from any further public exposure - "those unselfish and patriotic people who with total dedication serve their country - often putting their lives on the line." ## CAPITIL HILL

Secretary of State Kissinger was back on Capitol Hill today - with testimony before a Senate panel, criticizing Congressional restrictions on East-West trade. If it weren't for these restrictions - said he - the U.S. would be in a much better position to bring pressure to bear on the Soviets - in connection with Angola.

Dr. Kissinger adding, that "In view of the situation in Angola - this is not an appropriate time" to ask for revisions. Also, saying a projected Soviet-American natural gas deal has been held in abeyance - for the same reason.

**In a speech at Brussels - a grandson and namesake of the great Winston Churchill - was reading the riot act today to the U.S. Young Churchill, a conservative member of the British parliament - calling Detente "A disaster - just another word for appeasement."
