Governor Nelson Rockefeller of New York made an Annual most today—
all-out attack, teday, on Vice President Nixon Criticizing
the probable presidential candidate of the Republican Party—
for not revealing where he stands on dominant questions of
the day. The blast—all the more interesting, because of what
happened just before it was delivered.

This morning, Governor Rockefeller had a breakfast meeting with President Eisenhower at the White House. This - at the request of Nelson Rockefeller. Who, yesterday - asked for the appointment. Which raised an immediate surmise - that the talk would have something to do with the Rockefeller position in the presidential campaign. The Governor having made it clear - that he would be available for a draft at the G O P convention.

The President and his visitor talked for an hour and a half. Then, upon leaving the White House, Governor Rockefeller was asked - what went on? He replied that he would

speak his mind at a meeting of New York State Republican leaders.

- and there he certainly did speak his mind. Making his anti-Nixon statement at km the G O P conclave,

without mentioning the Vice President by name, He said: "Those was now assuming control of the Republican party have failed to make clear - where this party is heading, and where it proposes to lead the nation."

Then, if that wasn't pointed enough, he added:

"I find it unreasonable, in them these times - that the

leading Republican candidate for the prei presidential

nomination has firmly insisted upon making known his program

and his policies - not before, but only after, nomination

by his party."

He then proceeded with a list of problems confronting the nation, and virtually invited a Rockefeller

draft, by saying: "The new period now begins. It summons new men. New problems demand new ideas - new actions."

Well, we wonder - what was really said at that breakfast meeting of President Eisenhower and Governor Rockefeller.

In California, both sides are shouting "victory"!

The Nixon people - hailing yesterday's primary vote as a stunning success for the Vice President. Who ran - some ninety-five thousand votes ahead of Governor Brown. But the DENDER Democrats claim the figures are a sign - that they'll surely carry California in the November election.

Governor Brown, running as a California favorite son, was opposed by George McLain, on a program of old-age pensions. McLain - getting a surprisingly large vote. Nearly half as much - as Governor Brown.

So, while Nixon runs ahead of Brown, his figure is less than the combined total for the two Democrats. Which accords with the fact that, in California, more Democrats are registered than Republicans.

Rockefeller supporters in the Far Western xxxx state claim - they cut down the Nixon total. Having urged people who like Rockefeller - simply not to vote for Nixon.

Cast their ballots for local Republican candidates in the primary - and ignore the Vice President. They say their success is shown by the fact - that the Nixon figures, in various localities, re are less than those for local Republican candidates. This is denied, promptly - by the Nixon backers.

Today, the word is - that other professors in a variety of universities, are getting ready to endorse Kennedy.

Which may sound like a rally of one-time

Stevensonians - to the banner of the front runner in the

Democratic race.

In Tokyo, today, the government of Premier Kishi announced - that it will mobilize six hundred thousand people to cheer President Eisenhower, and give him a huge ovation. At the same time, Premier Kishi's political party is recuiting ten thousand vicilians - to help the Tokyo pi police keep order. Fifteen thousand police - mobilized to protect the Rrmi President, from the moment he arrives is at the Tokyo International Airport.

Less assuring is a statement from the Neo-fascist organization - that they'll bring out their people to combat the left wingers, who are opposing the President's visit.

This arouses fears of possible violent clashes between factions of extremists - right and left.

Today, a left wing labor organization, which claims three and a half million members, announced plans - for a massive anti-Eisenhower demonstration. In collaboration - with the fanatical student federation that has been making such noisy xx threats.

Today, the Socialist party of Japan again demanded - that the President's visit be postponed until the present political turmoil ends.

In Washington, the announcement - that the President will take off Sunday morning. Bound for Alaska, on the first leg of his Far Eastern tour. He will arrive in Japan - June Nineteenth.

A dispatch from the Tibetan krader border - tells of a military revolt, troops from China joining with Tibetan soldiers recruited by the Communists in an outbreak of mutiny.
