At Karachi - a giant rally today that drew a crowd of more than a million, at which Pakistan's President Zulfiqar Ali Bhutto asked for a "verdict of the people" - on the question of whether he should release unconditionally Bengali Nationalist leader Sheikh Mujibur Rahman.

The crowd's response a thundering "yes" - says radio Pakistan. Adding that Bhutto then pledged to free the rebel leader - in a few days after a few more talks. All of which is said to have caused scenes of jubilation - in the new state of Bengladesh.
