In the Middle East - it's now a race with time. Henry Kissinger attempting to wrap up a disengagement of troops between Israel and Syria - before heading home this weekend.

But along the way, Dr. Kissinger also hosting today - a luncheon for Syrian Foreign Minister Abdel Halim Khaddam. In a toast saying: "We have made great progress in this negotiation - and even if see for some reason we can't complete it on this trip we will certainly accomplish it in the near set future."

A request from the Senate Watergate committee for five White House tapes 4 was rejected unanimously by a federal court of appeals. The court observing that the committee can point - to no specific legislative decision that cannot responsibly be made without the tapes. Adding that "whatever force there might once have been in the committee's arguments - has been substantially undermined by subsequent events." That last - a reference to the President's release of edited transcripts - of thirty-one tapes; among them the five in question.

From the House Judiciary Committee a charge

today that the President's Watergate transcripts are - "inadequate" "unsatisfactory" and contain too
many errors; a charge promptly denied - by the
White House. Spokesman Ron Ziegler adding that
any questions of fact - can easily be resolved;
by having ranking members of the committee listen
to the actual tapes - as suggested earlier by the
President.

Meanwhile, the President \*\*imself was outting in a busy day meeting first with ranking members of the Senate Finance Committee - to push for passage of that long pending trade reform bill. Next, meeting with eight Soviet parliamentarians to discuss his forthcoming trip to the Soviet union. Also, meeting with Pakistani Foreign and Defense Minister Aziz Ahmed - to discuss the implications of India's new nuclear capability.

A couple of months ago - you may recall. a Russian helicopter from Siberia - was forced to crash land in a border area of Red China. Its three man crew - later accused of spying and threatened with prosecution. The negotiations that followed finally leading to a veiled threat today from Moscow. The Kremlin warning of "inevitable consequences" if the Chinese continue to fail to respect Soviet rights. Adding that one of these consequences would be the barring of Zh Chinese boats from inland waterways near the Russian border cityes of Khabarovsk which may not sound like much - except that in summer the waterways in question are mines absolutely vital to Chinese commerce.
