Secretary of State Kissinger arrived ~~today~~ in Israel - on the first leg of his latest quest for peace in the Middle East. In a brief arrival statement, with a catch in his throat - Dr. Kissinger recalled ^{ed} ~~ing~~ the failure of his "shuttle diplomacy" of last March; saying he left with the "feeling that still another horrible tragedy was in store for the people of Israel and the Middle East." Adding: "I return today with the same concern - but with renewed hope that a strong desire for peace will take precedence over war."

~~He~~ ^{He} then ~~proceeding~~ ^{went on} to Jerusalem - to begin his talks with top ~~Israeli~~ officials; but the traveled by helicopter instead of car - amid security precautions the tightest ever in peace time. This because of a series of protests by right wing Israelis - one of which blocked all traffic to and from the Israeli Knesset; briefly delaying ~~the~~ ^{the} Kissinger's arrival.
