## GENEVA

The eight neutral nations oo at that Geneva
disarmament conference - voted today to withdraw to the sidelines; Pending outcome - of preliminary east-west sparring.

Thädecision-taken at an hour-long meeting,
After which the consensus of the neutrals $\AA$ stated bor by
one Ambassador as follows: "We intend", said he, "to wait
and see whether the East and West really want serious
negotiations; or whether they just want to ex doit the conference - for propaganda purposes."

A House committee today approved - twenty
to one - a bill that would provide a billion dollar a year
pay increase for federal employees. And just coincidentally,

lowest income city in all America. Tunica County, Mississippi
-- last among all fifty states.

## The Senate - in an historic vote - tonight

rejected that constitutional amendment - offered by Senate Minority Majority Leader Everett Dirksen. An amendment that would have nullified the Supreme Court doctrine of "one man, one vote" \& in the apoc makeup of state legislatures.

The final tally - fifty-seven to thirty-nine just seven votes short of the required two thirds majority.

Academy award-Winning actress Patricia Nealtoday completed the greatest role of her life; Giving birth to a six-pound, seven-ounce girl -in a hospital This e
