Congress today gave its final approval for legislation that raises the nation's minimum wage from the present dollar-fifty to two-dollars-thirty cents an hour. - to be achieved in three stages between May of this year and January of Nineteen Seventy-Six. This to include some addition, the new law sembraces about, ten million workers not previously covered .- including domestic employees, government workers and retail chain employees. Earlier today, President Nixon said he will not veto this new measure as he did a similar one last year, believing it to be inflationary.

Spokesmen for both Moscow and Washington agreed today that Secretary Kissinger has failed to echieve the breakthrough he sought in the strategic arms limitations talks, to the Soviet capital, & joint statement, saying only that both sides are determined to find solutions to the stalemate. Pin Washington, Defense Secretary Schlesinger said President Nixon has no intention of trying himself to reach an arms agreement with the Soviets during his forthcoming summit visit to Russia this June. The President says Schlesinger - will do nothing to compromise U.S. national security.
