At this moment he may be out over the Polar Ice. But this is not just a solo flight to the North Pole. He is flying around the world, over both Poles, doing it all alone. Another fantastic first for one of the most unusual airmen in this Age of Aviation which has produced so many of our heroes.

For eleven years Max Conrad planned this flight; around the globe by way of both Poles; alone. Until now the US Navy would not give permission to any airman to undertake this because of the hazards involved, especially the flight across the Antarctic.
