## CUBA

The latest testimony by Secretary of State Rusk on Capitol Hill - brought out one interesting piece of information. Dean Rusk, telling the Senators - there is evidence that the Soviet people are worried about Cuba. The Russian people afraid of - war by miscalculation. Khrushchev's miscalculation on Cuba.

How dangerous this possibility is - also came out in the Rusk testimony. We are keeping Cuba under close surveillance and have warned other nations - we will intercept ships carrying red arms from Cuban ports; and we are ready for military action - should Castro try to run us out of Guantanamo.

U. N.

The American Ambassador speaking for the first time at this Session of the General Assembly - delivered a major policy address. Adlai Stevenson, covering controversial subjects - that will come up during the next few weeks.

On atomic testing, he reminded his colleagues - that the Soviets violated the test moratorium; so we would be fools to take Khrushchev's word - which he has broken so flagrantly. We still want a foolproof inspection system - run by the U.N. and we are ready to sign such an agreement - the moment Khrushchev accepts it.

## STRIKE

In Washington, Willard Wirtz was too busy today - to notice when he officially became Secretary of Labor. While the Senate was approving the Wirtz nomination as head of the Labor Department - he already was deep in discussions about the Midwest railroad strike; holding sessions with labor and management - in an effort to get the major issues defined so they can be presented to a presidential arbitration board.

We are told arbitration is about to begin; on the walkout that has paralyzed the great Chicago and Northwestern railroad.
