**SAN JOSE**

**Secretary of State Kissinger today completed his first diplomatic mission ever - to South and Central America; at San Jose, Costa Rica, as he prepared to head home - warning Cuba against interfering in Latin America as it has in Angola. Dr. Kissinger saying: "The U.S. will not tolerate any challenge - to the solemn treaty principle of non-intervention in this hemisphere."**

Richard Nixon today plunged into a crowd of well-wishers in Peking - shaking hands and chatting with <sup>almost</sup> Chinese as if on a U.S.-style campaign trip. Observers saying this was one of the few times a visiting foreign dignitary - has been allowed to meet spontaneously with the Chinese ~~citizens~~ people.

The former President also visiting his former Ambassador to the U.N., newsman John Scali - who <sup>had</sup> ~~was~~ <sup>been</sup> ~~earlier~~ hospitalized ~~in Peking~~ with bronchitis. Mr. Nixon telling Scali: "I stayed in a hospital bed a year ago, <sup>and</sup> ~~adding~~ "They'll never get me again - <sup>unless they</sup> ~~they'll have to~~ carry me in."
