## Lowell Thomas Broadcast, for the Literary Digest, Page Wednesday, Ref December, 16,1931

Today in Washington Secretary of State stimson appeared before the Ways and Means Committee of the House of Representatives and denounced attacks that, are being made on President Hoover $\boldsymbol{r}_{\boldsymbol{A}}$ Mr. Stimendend the President's Moratorium policy. He declared that the suspension of payments of war debts and reparations was necessary to stave off the threatened collapse of Germany.

And the secretary of State placed before the Committee a personal message from President vo Hindenburg of Germany to President Hoover. This letter was ${ }_{5}$ written on June $20 t h$, the day before ${ }^{16}$ Ho Ho the Mora17 Tor i um was announced.

The President of Germany wrote to 19 the President of the United Statespafollows:"The German people must continue to have the possibility of working under toilerable living conditions." And he spoke of the tension in Germany caused by distress and despair.

At the same time, w ir $e^{s}$ the Unit ed
${ }_{1}$ Press, Under-Secretary of the Treasury, 2 Ogden Mills appeared before the Finance Committee of the Senate. He stated that President Hoover is opposed to the cancellation of war debts, and he added that if congress failed to 7 ratify the Hoover Moratorium, it would 8 cause irretrievable damage to the - Country's reputation.

These are powerful efforts which the Administrati on is making to persuade 12 Congress to agree to the Moratorium.

A few more emphatic words come echoing from Weshington this evening. Secretary of Wer Hurley came out with a statement that can only be described by the old familiar adjective "Ringing", a ringing statement. He defended Fresident Hoover all un and down the line. Secretary Hurley gave a long list of Mr. Hoover's echievements. And then the Associated Press quotes him as making the following declaration:
"Throughout the depression the President has been doing the work thet should pronerly fall unon the leaders of industry, commerce and banking. In all previous disturbances finance has had its intrepid leader or leaders. Today", added Mr. Hurley, "we hear leaders of finance shouting for leadershiv. But they present very little evidence of thet quality in their own establishments. They fall back on the President of the United states .- throw all their problems onto his lap and throw up their honds and shout, 'Save Us'".

And those are the words of Fat Hurley, from

Oklahoma the fighting Secretary of War. And they are regarded as an opening gun in the cemnaign to renominate Mr. Hoover.

Senator Borah came out today with a blast in favor of Soviet Russia. The Sen ator has introduced a resolution calling upon Uncle Sam to establish diplomatic relations with the Red regime at Moscow.)

The United Press quotes Senator Borah as declaring that the world cannot have anything like economic sanity and solidarity until the United States and Russia get together. He points out that Russia has a standing army of six hundred thous and men, and that there can be no real disarmament without Russia's friendship and cooperation. charges are made.

The athletic authorities at the University come back with a general and indignant denial. The United Press quotes Lou Little, the football coach, as declaring that the report is nothing but falsehood.

Well, we all know that year after year these charges of professional ism and semi-professional ism are brought against football teams in colleges all over the country. Accusations are solemnly made and results of investigations are set forth. There is a general argument and after that nothing happens.

There is a rumor in Panama, a rumor that comes from across the Vicaraguan border, to the effect that President Moncado of Nicaragua has an aeroplane ready in case he has to leave the country.

The International News Service passes along claims made by the Revolutionists in Nicaragua. These are that Sandino is in control of ten states and that the situation looks so bad to President Mo ado that he is ready to take wing at any time and fly away. It should be noted that these reports come from sources identified with 15 the Revolutionary movement in Nicaragua.

I've had to do a bit of driving around today. It's been chilly, and I had it impressed on me with shivers that it's winter all right.

And then there's the travel advertising in which we see handsome illustrations of pleasant warm weather scenes.

One advertisement shows us an old-fashioned scene on the balmy shores of Florida. Another gives us an Hawaiian dance with the moon peeping over a hill on a South Sea Isle. And there are beautiful panoramas of $\mathrm{C}_{\mathrm{a}}$ lifornia, and scenes on shipboard and passengers boarding airplanes bound for some balmy sunny clime. And then there is a great deal about winter sports in Canada, because Canada is a vacation Mecca at all seasons.

To tell you the truth, I have read hardly a line in the new Digest. I've been busy going through it, looking at the pictures and traveling in imagination to all those fascinating winter resorts.

No, I am not going to read any forty page letter, so don't be alarmed. That exceedingly long epistle has just been written by Hamdsome Adolf Hitler, the leader of Germany's Fascist Party.

The Associated Press comments that for some days now Hitler has been threatening to speak his mind right out and now he has done the speaking in the shape of a letter forty-pages long.

It is addressed to Chancellor
Bruening, head of the German Government', and has been given out for publ ic ation. Let's take two. I ines those forty pages.

Hitler, in denouncing the present Government of Germany, seems to think that its policy has not been sufficiently inspired. He it all in this phrase. "Our honor has been taken from $u s$, ye $t$ ${ }^{21}$ you talk about nothing but economics".

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1 to mere figures and cold reason. He puts 2 things on a basis of emotion and pride, and that goes a long way with people of any nation.
