At the White House -- a preview today of President Johnson's first major election-year speech. The President briefing members of his cabinet - on the contents of his annual State of the Union message; scheduled for delivery to a joint session of Congress at nine tonight, Washington-time.

However, chief topics expected to include - a broad restatement of US goals in Vietnam; also a **mpx** number of proposals for solving domestic problems - such as taxes, crime in the streets and the war on poverty. The decline and fall of the British Empire subject **no** for heated debate today in the House of Commons. With Conservative Party opposition - quickly calling for a vote of no confidence in the Labor Government. Charging Prime Minister Harold Wilson with gross "mismanagement of the British economy" - leading to the present sorry stde of affairs.

Burden of the defense - falling to chancellor of the Exchequer Roy Jenkins - who said: "it does not make sense - to go on trying to play a role beyond our economic strength. From here forward - he added -"our part in world affairs must be underpinned by economic strength - and not undermined by economic weakness." <u>CANBERRA FOLLOW LONDON</u> Halfway round the world at Canberra, furthaling no such debate. Australia moving quickly today to fill at least a part of the vacuum - expected to result from British withdrawal "east of Suez". Defense Minister Alan Fairhall indicating that Australia will deal first with defense needs - in Malaysia and Singapore, fier that -- wextile werth; we'll have to wait and see. War news from Vietnam tells today of an American sweep - through war zone "C" near the Cambodian border. U.S. air cavalrymen - uncovering **an** a hastilyevacuated Viet Cong supply base. Spoils of war including sugar, rice, noodles, sardines and tobacco - grand fare for the Viet Cong; also a number secret documents - plus an unexpected bonus: New Year's greetings -- from North Vietnamese President **and** Chi Minh.

Back at Saigon - a report today that a

controversial general has been replaced at last - as commander of South Vietnam's twenty-fifth Army Division. Brigadier General Phan Trong Chinh perhaps best known for losing more men in one month to **causs** automobile accidents - than he did to enemy action. Sasebo, Japan -- a day-long series of street clashes loday. Riot police battling thousands of anti-American demonstrators -- protesting a scheduled visit from the nuclear-powered U.S. aircraft carrier Enterprise. Clod More of the same - in Tokyo. Police of the two cities - later reporting more than a hundred-and-fifty casualties; even as scattered skirmishes continued on late into the night.

This latest: The leaders of five main Japanese opposition parties -- arriving in Sasebo tonight to join the demonstrations. These including top officers of the Japanese Communist party - the **Ja**xn Japan Socialist party - also the political arm of the Soka Gakkai Religious sect. The latter - participating in a demonstration for the first time. President Tito of Jugoslavia - on the

receiving end of a giant welcome today - at Phnom Penh in Cambodia. Prince Sihanouk letting out all the stops;as promised; affording his Communist guest a royal reception - easily matching that for French President DeGaulle a year-and-a-half ago.

At the same time - the Prince attempting to cast Cambodia in the same independent mold as Jugoslavia. Calling the two nations "two friends who both have refused prefabricated decisions - following an original path -responding to their own requirements." In reply- Tito asserting that Cambodia "deserves full international support" - for attempting to pursue a neutralist policy.

The US Supreme Court - Prime target today for Michigan's Governor Romney; in the wind-up of his first foray # into the New Hampshire presidential campaign. (But you must understand" - he went on - "that the Jewish State extsts within the Arab world" and has a right to do so. The only alternative² - said he - "another war.²

Looking famaf to the future - General Dayan concluding: "You are Generals - you will obey orders; and if commanded - fight - and we will fight back. But it is my hope" said he - "that this was the last war."
