It has been raised to the distinction of a strategy - in which the lie, the garbled word and trickery, have come to be week accepted weapons of offense, which some people with the skill of professionals, broadcasting even of their competence."

That is, the strategy of the lie as a technique in the battle of prog propaganda, ideology and power politics.

The Papal address never once mentioned Soviet

Russia or Communism, but the implication was clear in such

phrases as - *** "Fomenter of hatred," and - "Denver

Nowhere in the world was Christmas Eve celebrated in more fitting style than at the tiny village of Oberndorf, in Austria. Elsewhere, choirs and organs intoned Christmas carols, but in Oberndorf the music of the nativity was performed by two men and a guitar—two voices accompanied by chords on a guitar. The reason for this curiesty of church music is made amply exe evident by a Christmas story of olden days.

Oberndorf, the country people flocked to the village church for the services on Christmas Eve. There the priest, Father Joseph Mohr, told them he had a surprise - a new Christmas Carol. He himself had written the lyric, while the village school teacher and church the organist had composed the tune. It and the schoolmaster would sing it - to the accompaniment of a guitar. That was because the church organ had broken down, and they couldn't have any organ music.

So in the glimmering light of the candles on the altar, the priest and the schoolmaster sang their

yuletide song, while the Priest played the accompaniment for church music — on that most unchurchlike instrument - a guitar. It was a world premier, the first performance of what is now the world's favorite among Christmas carols - "Silent Night, Holy Night."
