Our State Department rejects the criticism in the case of two Communist newsmen who were assigned to cover the United Nations. They were taken into custody for deportation, whereupon the Secretary General of the U. N. Trygvie Lie, protested that this violated rights of the U.N. in the matter of news.

The State Department replies that the $\mathbb{U} . N$. was supposed to notify the United States Government in the case of newsmen assigned to the international organization and this was not done in the case of the Communist Journalist from Greece and the Red correspondent from India. The former was accredited by a U.N. clerk, acting $x$ on his own. The latter was over here on a student's visa.

He himself had written the lyric, while the village school teacher and church He said that he organist had composed the tune. 㐨 and the schoolmaster would sing it - to the accompaniment of a guitar. That was because the church organ had broken down, and they couldn't have any organ music.

So in the glimmering light of the candles on the altar, the priest and the schoolmaster sane their
