Bruce Makes the letter, in his dakan debut as chief

American peace envoy - presenting today a straight forward, no nonsense approach. discussion on the issues." "We both need to take another

of a settlement - a settlement that will bring a just and
lasting peace." The Ambassador adding: "I ask for your
cooperation in this task -xand I offer you mine."

In sum then, David Bruce revealing no new proposals -- no significant shift in emphasis; nothing at all - "startling" to use his own words; just an honest desire - to get the talks off dead an center.

didn't get far today. - it must be admitted. An enemy spokesman later telling newsmen - "there had been nothing new."

Observers noting, nevertheless-a sudden sense of renewed optimism - whether real or merely wishful thinking - only time can tell.

Here at home - the warm news was also looking up on the draft front. The Pentagon announcing that draft calls for the next four months - will come to only thirty-nine thousand men; which means the total number of draftees for the entire year - will be the lowest since nineteen Sixty-Four. Defense Secretary Metrin Laird crediting the draft cutback to - "the success of the Vietnamization program" noting that withdrawals from Vietnam have already totalled more than a hundred and thirty thousand men; with more heading home - every day.

Selective Service Director Curtis Tarr adding that draft eligible youths with a lottery number higher than one ninety-five -- are now almost sure of being exempt.

For all this, though - Washington reports increasing progress in behind the scenes diplomacy. State Department sources adding that a bona fide cease fire before the end of the week is still a distinct possibility.

From Georgetown Universities prectigious center for strategic and international studies - a report today telling of a massive Soviet buildup in car Asia. The Russians, said to have increased by at least thirty divisions - the number of Soviet troops now stationed along their four thousand mile border with Red China where I was a few weeks ago. The study further reporting that these troops - "are armed with artillery, rockets, aircraft, and all the equipment necessary for waging conventional or nuclear war." Study director Robert Kilmar adding: "So intense is the hostility" on the Sino-Soviet frontier -"that the Chinese charge they are confronted not with a friendly Communist ally - but rather an hereditary eath Chinese putit, enemy;" one that "has embarked on a policy to destroy China - not only as a Communist power but as a nation."

Rome again - a new Italian Premier - at Christian Democrat Emilio Colombo -- agreeing today to pick up the reins of command; succeeding ex-Premier Mariano Rumor - who resigned was there month ago, Thas heading the thirty-second Italian government a since the fall of Fascism at in Nineteen Forty-Three. Colombo himself - a treasury minister in eight of those governments. Now coming to full power with the backing of a new coalition - including, in addition to his own party the Socialists, the unitarian socialists and the Republicans. And a good think thing - For what with present conditions in Italy he'll need all the help he can get.

From the Vatican - at Rome - a ban today on all "eccentric and arbitary" forms of worship - at least, in Italy.
