

The reports of massive rioting near Rostov in the Soviet Union - are corroborated by two facts. First, a tight curfew - clamped over the entire area. The Russians, ordered off the streets by ten at night - except with special permission. secondly, an order barring foreigners - from travel to Rostov. The official reason - a cholera epidemic. But if there was an epidemic in Rostov - it didn't prevent a group of Soviet officials from holding a conference there, at the time.

If the riots really occurred - and most Kremlinologists are convinced ~~that~~ they did - there is no mystery about the cause. This violence, following closely upon - the sudden rise in prices. Khrushchev, hiking the cost of living by thirty percent - and warning that no criticism would be tolerated. Evidently, there was criticism - all the same. The Soviet people, using - sticks, stones and fists. Also - anti-Khrushchev slogans. We are told that they suffered many casualties - when they were subdued by the Red Army.

ASSASSIN

The Red assassin on trial in Karlsruhe, West Germany, is telling the ~~the~~ court a fantastic tale about Soviet intelligence. Bogdan Stashinsky, describing to the court - how ~~he~~ he was trapped in Khrushchev's net. His crime against the Soviet State - an illegal train ride. BERLIN

~~There was~~ ^{tough} talk - in West Berlin, today. The toughest, from Mayor Willy Brandt - who said, "if Khrushchev wants a war, he will get it." This statement obviously intended - to put allied policy on the line. Brandt, just back from Washington - encouraging the West Germans, and warning the Soviets.

The point being that western observers expect - another Berlin crisis next month. Possibly Khrushchev's long-threatened peace treaty - with his East German puppets. Which might be followed by - East German interference with the access routes to West Berlin, ^{and} grave danger - ^{Berlin} of a shooting war.

Western spokesmen are trying to make Khrushchev see where that policy - if he adopts it - will lead.

COMMON MARKET

The latest British appeal in Brussels - is for speed, and concessions. Speed - to get Britain into the Common Market. Concessions - to make that entrance as ~~an~~ palatable as possible to the Commonwealth nations.
