The reports of massive rioting near Rostov in the Soviet Union - are corroborated by two facts. First, a tight curfew - clamped over the entire area. The Russians, ordered off the streets by ten at night - except with special permission secondly, an order barring foreigners - from travel to Rostov, The official reason - a cholera epidemic. Which might be followed by - East German interference with the access routes to West Berlin, Frave danger - I a shooting
war.

Western spokesmen are trying to make Khrushchev see where that policy - if he adopts it - will lead.
