KOREA - TRUCE L.T. P. &. G. JUNE 9. 1953

A dispatch from Tokyo states that the big question at the moment is - not when will the armistice be signed, but what will South Korea do about it? There is almost complete optimism about a U.N. - U.S.A. agreement with the Reds. Negotiators from both sides were putting on the finishing touches today. And from the truce camp, we hear that the fighting probably will end imas few days.

But Syngman Rhee is still opposed to an armistice that would leave Korea divided. Today a report from Seoul, said he was planning a last minute appeal to President Eisenhower, to kill the armistice. Also, the South Korean Premier was reported about to fly to Washington, to see the President - or to Tokyo, to talk to General Mark Calrk,. These are just rumors so far, - but they indicate how much Syngman Rhee opposes the plans for an armistice.

Meanwhile, the Lower House of the South Korean
Parliament calls on the Syngman Rhee government to ignore
the armistice, and launch a military drive to expel

the Reds and unify the whole penimsula, a most ambitious project! Crowds of South Koreans have been demonstrating in Seoul, protesting against the truce - and shouting:
"Unification or death!"

Today we also hear that only nine high Korean military officers are being called home from America not the four hundred officers who were said to be leaving this country - abruptly leaving the military schools in which they have been studying. Furthernore, Syngman Rhee has not accepted the resignation of his delegate to the truce talks. Nevertheless the South Korean Government still refuses to accept the armistice - and threatens to keep fighting after the U.N. and the Reds have come to terms.

KOREA-WAR follow KOREA-TRUCE

More bitter fighting at the front. The scene that output known as Luke's Castle. North and South
Koreans battling for what will be the final line.

At the moment, the Reds are in possession. But the South Koreans are attacking in an all-out attempt to drive them off.

Elsewhere both sides apparently were trying to avoid casualties, with the end of the war in sight.

CHURCHILL

Winston Churchill still wants a meeting of the Big Four. Speaking in the Commons he said that he still stands for a meeting at Bermuda with President Eisenhower and the French Premier. Also, he has not changed his opinion that there should be a later meeting of all three with Malenkov.

The Prime Minister arguing that nothing happening at Panmunjon, can make a Big Four meeting unnecessary.

Then Churchill went on to praise the way we have handled the Korean negotiations; contradicting the criticism of America that of late has been so outspoken in Britain.

He noted that our leaders have been held up by Communist obstinacy - the Reds refusing to come to an agreement up to now. He added that there is one

obstacle that has not been so apparent until now - Syngman Rhee. Churchill pointing out to the Commons, that we have gone ahead in spite of Communist delays, and the opposition of Syngman Rhee.

As he was speaking, others saying that Britain must be represented at any conference involving that Britain must be represented at any conference involving Korea. Also, the Prime Ministers of the Dominions add that their countries, too, must be represented - either directly or through the British representative.

ITALIAN ELECTIONS

In the Italian elections, Premier deGasperi's government is clinging precariously to its majority. So far, returns show that his pro-Western lineup has been losing ground. The Minister of the Interior claims a majority in the Senate, but greatly reduced from what it had been.

But the important elections are those of the Chamber of Deputies - the Lower House, which really minimal controls the government. All the returns are not in yet.

And the Minister of the Interior refuses to make any predictions.

The democratic coalition, led by deGasperi, needs at least fifty per cent of the seats to control the Chamber of Deputies. But a strong challenge is coming from the Communists, the Fascists, and the monarchists.

Which leaves Italy facing the danger that makes the French government so weak. Many parties, but none with control every Premier faced with a almost hopeless dilemma. So, we may face the spectacle of Italian Premiers rising and falling - as in France. If de Gasperi has not won a

a solid victory, he will be faced with a crisis; - and then one crisis may follow another.

owners. A move to strenthen the loyalty of the natives caught behind the Red lines. Bao Dai is also improving the condition of the farmers. And limiting the amount of land that one man can own - in order to prevent the rise of big landlords again.

So Bao Dai uses a traditional weapon against the Communists - proving to his people that he is the supporter of the small peasant against the landlord. Which undermines the propaganda of the Reds, that they are the ones on whom the peasantry should rely.

Elizabeth. The British monarch, Crowned a week ago today, And since then she has been through a series of official functions and public appearances. The coronation itself was exhausting enough. A dispatch from London describes the young Queen as pale and wane. Saturday she went to the derby at Epsom Downs and rested her head on the railing of the royal box for some minutes. That, the greatest of all racing events at which the littles saw her colt come in second. Second to Sir Gordon.

Today the Queen made her fourth and final visit to the outlying districts of London. She was accompanied by the Duke of Edinburgh. And that London dispatch says that, Calthough she smiled and waved at the crowds - the strain was beginning to show.

Now for the Everest story. We all know how those two mountaineers, Hillary and Tensing, climbed to the top of the world's highest mountain - just in time to make their feat a coronation present to the Queen. Now, a dispatch from Nepal tells of a flight over Everest.

The plane, flown by an Indian pilot. It took off from the Air Force base at Bihar, flew high into the Himalayas, and on over Mt. Everest at an altitude of more than Thirty-two thousand feet; some three thousand feet above the summit.

The crew of the plane were shooting pictures balck and white, and color. Back in Nineteen Thirty-Three,
some British airmen, lead by the then Marquis of Clydesdale - now Duke h of Hamilton, were the first to look
down on Everest. They filmed it - and I edited those

Then during World War II Colonial Robert Scott, author of "God Was My Co-Pilot" flew it in a pursuit plane so the Indians were the third to fly over Everest.

The original idea was for the plane to cross just as the mountaineers were on their last lap to the top. But this plan had to be called off - for fear that the sound of the engines would loosen snow on the slopes. Which might bring down tremendous avalanches on the mountaineers. So the flight was postponed until Hillary and Tensing and the rest, were safely out of the way. And then the plane went over the spot where the two men had been not long before.

We don't know yet whether Hillary and Tensing are bringing back any pictures of what they saw on the third Pole - the dizziest height on the face of the globe. But we know that the airmen have certainly brought back photographs. And pretty soon crowds will be flocking to the theatres to see them.

After the mid week the East. Tonight

Tornadoes smashed through Massachusetts and New Hampshire, Some thirty deaths reported, and more than three hundred injured in Massachusetts alone. In the city of Worcester, two hundred houses knocked flat. And the twister that hit the city picked up debris and carried it forty-five miles into the Boston area. The Worcester hospital is filled with the injured and Governor Christian Herter is at the scene of the disaster. Blice cars moving *** into the area to send radio reports because telephone lines are down in many places. All firemen and nurses in the city, called out for emergency duty.

So, tornados have appeared in different parts of the country within the space of a few hours. The Weather Bureau states that the Massachusetts storm is not connected with the tornados that hit Michigan and Ohio. The eastern seaboard, producing its own twister almost matching those of the mid-west.

As the result of these storms -and many others of the past few months, Congressman Ray Madden, of Indiana, is calling for an investigation. He wants to know many whether there is any relation between the atomic bomb explosions and the tornados. Speaking over the radio, Madden said that the Weather Bureau has never known so many tornados as this year. A number of atomic tests have taken place this year. So Congressman Madden asks - is there any connection between the two, between the explosions and the twisters.

TORNADO

Michigan and Ohio are digging themselves out of the wreckage left by tornadoes - twisters that killed more than a hundred and left a wide swath in both states.

But, as usual with tornadoes there were curious and weird incidents.

There was the man who had his shoes snatched off
by the whirling wind. But he remained! At one place in
Ohio, the winds lifted a ten thousand pound tractor from
a highway - and dropped it gently in a nearby field. The
driver in the cab the whole time. Believe it or not the
tractor landed right side up. Whereupon the driver
jumped out and hid under the thing. Later it was driven
away under its own power.

One man was hit by a piece of timber, that had been wrenched from a barn in an adjoining township. And a cow was killed by a two-by-four that the wind drove clean through the cow.
